K-8th grade youth in the Wautoma Area School District service area (*Including youth* attending homeschool, online and private schools)

- Youth who can attend 4 or more days per week on average

Program Results

ENROLLMENT & ATTENDANCE:

- 20% (178 youth) of K-8 students in the WASD enrolled (decrease of 65 (7%))*
- 125 students attended A+ each day on average (decrease of 41)*
- 87% were regular attendees (30+ days) (same as previous year)
- 69% were frequent attendees (90+ days) (23% increase)**
- On average, regular attendees attended 109 days of A+ (increase of 21)**
- 160 days of programming were offered (increase of 44 days) **



Spring 2021 Teacher Perception Survey Results




TEACHER SURVEYS:




iReady Academic Growth Results

"The Power of a Song, Learning in a Fun Way!"

"I had the opportunity to work with two students in 3rd grade who were struggling with word and number recognition. Neither student knew the numbers or words for eight, nine, or ten. The game we played was Dr. Seuss themed and addressed that challenge.

When the game began one student was in need of the instructions being presented in various ways before he understood. The other student was very patient and was engaged in trying to explain the game directions too. We played a "practice" game with no winner or loser. After a few attempts the student began to catch on. As we played more rounds his excitement grew and he even won a few times.

As we were cleaning up, the student that struggled at first began to cry because he did not want to stop. I started singing a jingle about the spelling of the word eight. The boys joined in and the crying stopped.

As we walked back to the classroom we sang the jingle and danced down the hallway as we sang! Before I left for the day, the struggling student asked me if I could come back the next day. I did, and when I walked into the room both boys began wiggling and singing our song for spelling the word eight! It made me smile to think of how many times their families and teachers heard that song and wondered about the dance! I am anxious to see if it will continue in fall when we return!" - A+ Employee

"Relationships Make a Difference!"

I saw a difference in one of our middle school students. He went from causing problems, to understanding that how he acted made others react in certain ways that were not always good, to calming down and thinking about what his behaviors would be seen as. We had long talks some days and he treated me with respect. It was a sad day when he stopped attending A+, the guardian only saw A+ as socializing, but he did do homework and learn better behaviors!" - A+ Employee


