Math teachers are continuing to design and build UbD units on professional development days.
Last Friday was a very interesting day for parents, students and staff as we dealt with the repercussions of a Tik Tok
challenge. Many parents faced a difficult decision on whether or not to send their child to school. Bleach was roughly $53 \%$ attendance. While walking through the classrooms some of the 5 th grade students were having a discussion about this incident. They indicated that an education was a privilege and that the Tik Tok post was like a bully trying to take that privilege away. They said they wanted to come to school because they did not want the bully to dictate their life and their chance at an education. I thought this was a very powerful message from some of our students that attended class on Friday.
We would like to give a special thank you to Diane from Accent. Unfortunately, we have been having a very difficult time filling the janitorial duties on the day shift at Blesch. Diane continues to work extra hours because she
wants the students to have a clean school. We greatly appreciate her dedication to our district and our students.

continue to show up and give everything they have for the students. Our day to day teaching continues to get weirder and weirder based on many situations outside our control.
