# **Board Treasurer**

### **Electric Choice Update**

SB 437, which would eliminate electric choice for schools, has stalled as DTE works to get enough votes in the House to move the bill. The bill does not, technically, eliminate electric choice, however, it drives alternate electric suppliers from the market through new requirements that will result in higher costs and eliminate any savings that customers like Huron Valley Schools, currently receive. As of last week, this bill was still sitting on the House floor.

# **Senate Moves Sinking Funds to Floor**

The Senate Appropriations Committee passed Oakland Representative Mike McCready's House Bill 4388 to expand the allowable use of sinking funds. The bill expands a school district's permissible use of sinking funds to include school security improvements and technology. It passed the House in June. Under the bill, all sinking funds could be authorized up to a maximum of 3 mills for a period not to exceed 10 years. As of last week, this bill was still sitting on the Senate floor.

## **Student Count Day**

Our official fall count day will take place October 5, 2016. We have budgeted for a blended student count of 9,176 students for the current fiscal year ending 06.30.17.

Financial Statement Audit

Last week, the external auditors, Plante & Moran, concluded the fieldwork portion of the district's financial statement audit for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2016. Fieldwork includes examining records, on a test basis, in order to form an opinion about the district's financial statements. The auditors will continue to compile information necessary for the completion of the audit over the next several weeks and will present their findings to the district in November.
