The school will have the Annual Title I Meeting in November 2021, to inform parents & families of Title 1, Part A program benefits. The meeting will be separate from any other meetings or activities to ensure that ample time is provided to describe/explain school curriculum, inform on types of academic assessments used to measure student progress, and on proficiency level students are expected to meet. Depending on CDC, ADH and other government guidelines, the meeting will be held virtually or in person.

- School officials will provide parents updates about school news, a calendar of school activities, and parenting tips related to school achievement such as homework tips, organizational skills, and study skills that is developed with the collaboration of the principal, staff, and parent volunteers. A monthly newsletter will be created by the parent facilitator to share the decided information.

- A committee of parents & teachers will create a pamphlet explaining the school's involvement with the state's reading initiative & how parents can be involved in supporting this initiative at home.
- Each teacher will create a classroom in Microsoft Teams that will include information helpful to students. Resources will also be available on school websites and through classroom newsletters. Also, parents can access all of their children's grades using the Home Access Center with the same password received at the beginning of the school year.
- Each teacher will send home a Daily Communication folder containing informational notes, work samples each week, and/or planner page for daily assignments. Parents may be asked to sign the folder and send it back to school.
- Teachers will routinely contact parents on an individual basis to communicate about their child's progress and upcoming classroom and school events by email, a weekly newsletter, or Daily Communication folder. In addition, they may also use the Remind communication app or Class Dojo.
- The school will provide progress reports and report cards to parents four times a year with information regarding their child's academic progress.
- The school will send parents a parent-friendly letter that explains their child's test results and standardized test scores. Parents will receive a Star Reading report explaining their child's reading level progress twice a year.
- The school will offer parents a special meeting(s) each year on the school's approach to school improvement. This meeting will be onsite or virtual, depending on the guidelines from CDC, ADH, and other government recommendations.
- The school will send notes home with students & post notices in school buildings & on social media sites about parent meetings whether they are onsite or virtual.
- The school will use the student handbook, school Web site, and parent orientation meetings about the Schoolwide Title I Plan and how to get a copy upon request.

Hoxie PTO will continue to support grades K-12 to foster parental and community involvement within the school. Upcoming plans will be based on the CDC, ADH, and other government guidelines.

The schools will work closely with area churches and area organizations to collect funds and supplies for the school backpack program to ensure students' needs are met.

The school participates in a community-wide "Stuff the Bus" program to ensure students have the required materials needed to be successful in the classroom. This year donations will be accepted at a local Walmart on August 7th.

These items will be incorporated into the school's improvement plan.

The school works closely with the "Hoxie 21" founders to ensure the preservation of local history & promote Civil Rights & equality in education.

The school will hold an orientation for parents at each grade level to inform them about the school's participation in the Title I program and to encourage parents to be involved with reviewing and revising of the School's Title I Plan.

Teachers will hold conferences individually with parents of children in their classrooms on Friday, September 17, 2021 & Friday, February 11, 2022, virtually and/or onsite. Parents will be given a summary of their student's progress, a report of their student's grades, & an explanation of the interventions teachers are using to assist the child in reaching achievement goals. Families & teachers will engage in a discussion of how these efforts can be supported by family involvement & explanations of homework/grading procedures will be given to families.

The school will offer parents a "Testing Night" meeting each year to provide an explanation of the statewide assessment system, standards, and other accountability measures. Depending on health guidelines, this will be offered virtually and/or onsite.

The school will encourage parents to participate in the following roles & activities to increase their involvement and support for student learning, as much as possible, while following health guidelines from CDC, ADH, and other government guidelines. These activities may be onsite or virtual.
