At the beginning of each school year, the district will provide a copy of the school policy at each school for parents to view as well as provide a copy to each parent.

The district will monitor each Title I, Part A school to ensure that each school performs the following tasks:

Develop parents and family engagement policy.

Offer flexible meeting times.

Provide information to parents about the school's program, include parent information guide.

Develop and use the SchoolParent Compact.

Training for parents will be provided in working with their child to improve academic achievement, to include training on the phone notification system and Microsoft Teams in order to have realtime access to their child's attendance and achievement.

Encourage parents to visit/volunteer at school by assisting staff in developing volunteer opportunities as well as training staff to encourage and build volunteer efforts.
