Student/Teacher Classroom Placement Procedure for the 2023-2024 School Year:

In the spring, at the close of the school year, the following process is used to determine student/teacher classroom placement for the next year.

- Infinite Campus will balance students into classes according to the following factors: Number of students, Gender, Ethnicity, Academic Needs
- Grade level teachers will discuss student/teacher matches, in relation to academic performance, social needs, behavior, and attendance, and meet with the next level teachers to finalize class rosters.
- Classroom assignments will be mailed home approximately May 1st.
- The morning of Field Day there will be a 30-minute meet and greet with new teachers.
- A formal (written & in-person) parent request must be made **before June 1st** with/to the Principal for any changes to classroom assignments. Requests cannot be guaranteed.
- Classroom lists are final June 1st. Class lists can only be changed after June 1st by the building administrator.


