WHAT WE ARE LEARNING

Math

- In math we are naming and identifying fractions. We are talking about the numerator and denominator and what they tell us about the fractions. We are working on our 9 multiplication facts this week.

Science

- We will continue learn about rocks, and identify our rocks that we brought to class.

Social Studies:

- We have began our new unit on Expedition and Migration. This unit is about the "Game Changers" who inspired the world to explore, increased the world's knowledge, or impacted the culture of a particular region. A study guide will be completed in class but students should bring their notebook home daily.

Reading/Writing

- We are studying our reading unit on Mysteries. We are reading our class mystery called A to Z Mysteries The Absent Author. Be sure to ask your child about our reading.
- Students should read 15 minutes each night (preferably fiction/mystery). We will not do a reflection sheet this week.
- Please have students work on their sight words. This week's sight words are: **much, myself, never, only** We are working on opinion/persuasive writings.
