Superintendent Report

Good News Report

According to Niche.com, which ranks school district across the nation based on ELA and math scores, class size, and enrollment rated the Platte-Geddes School District as 5th in South Dakota. The district is rated as the #4 best district to teach in and as the #4 district with the best teachers. Neighborhood Scout is a similar platform to Niche.com and currently ranked the Platte-Geddes School District as the #6 best district in South Dakota. Supt. Bailey congratulated the students, teachers, staff members, and administration.

Supt. Bailey congratulated the 6^{th} grade girl's basketball team for winning the Menno Tournament and also the 7^{th} and 8^{th} grade boy's basketball team on winning the Dakota Christian Tournament on Saturday.

Superintendent Report

Automatic Building Controls and Schuman Electric completed the installation of the new fire panel at the elementary over the holiday break. The new compressors and condensers for the walk-in cooler and freezer have also been installed in the kitchen.

The district has been working with engineers and architects providing them information for the upcoming repairs and renovations. Mrs. Knecht, Mrs. Holter, and Supt. Bailey had two design and development meetings with Site Logiq before Christmas. A floor plan has been agreed upon for the secured elementary entrance. Preliminary plans were presented to the board. The next design and development meeting will be on Wednesday, January 12.

One of the issues with the secure elementary entrance addition is the location of Midstate Communications telecom post that is located on the southwest corner of the elementary. The electrical engineer and Midstate are working to come up with a cost estimate for relocating the post or if it is possible to build around it while making it accessible for repairs.

Supt. Bailey met with Catherine Dekkenga, from JLG Architects on Monday, January 10 to discuss the potential addition for the wrestling room and cheer/ dance practice area. Ms. Dekkenga has been part of

similar additions across the state. She will be submitting cost estimates based on the current market and project scopes.

Mrs. Hubers and Supt. Bailey have been working on filing the district's Special Education Child Count and completing the Civil Rights Data Survey. This survey is based on the 2020-2021 school year and requires reports for all of the schools in the district.

The principals and Supt. Bailey met with Mark Petersen to discuss a COVID vaccination clinic. The administration agreed that they would assist walking elementary students to the clinic if the shots were administered during the school day. Participation would be 100% voluntary and would require parent permission and signature of required forms. Supt. Bailey stressed that the district is not pushing vaccines, but simply serving as a good steward in assisting the Platte Health Center. The board of education supported the administrative decision.

Supt. Bailey informed the board that the Bright Beginnings after school program has been moved to the old wrestling room which is a larger room. The district does not charge Bright Beginnings for room rent or any utilities. They have made two payments of \$500.00 each in July of 2019 and May of 2020.

Business Manager Report

Notice of School Board Vacancies will be published in the newspapers the last two weeks of January. Petitions may be picked up and begin circulation on Friday, January 28th and must be filed with the business manager by Friday, February 25th. The terms of Dennis DeBoer, Roxanne Summerville, and Heather VanDerWerff expire on June 30, 2022.

The district received the proceeds from the sale of Capital Outlay Certificates from D.A. Davidson on Thursday, December 30th in the amount of \$5,580,626.00. These funds are in an account at Bank of the West. A preliminary draw down schedule was received from SitelogIQ with the first draw scheduled for January 2022 in the approximate amount of \$378,555.00.

The Impact Aid Application is near completion. K. Holter is waiting for a certification of South Dakota School District Acres from the state which needs to be submitted with the application. Deadline to submit the application is January 31st.

The district's ESSER III Application was approved by Grants Management on December 29. With this grant, a percentage of the indirect costs will be restricted. An amendment will need to be filed to account for this requirement. Grants Management has not yet updated their system to split these costs.

K. Holter will attend SASD's Delegate Assembly on Tuesday, February 1st in Pierre. This meeting is comprised of approximately twelve representatives from each parent group. Participants review SASD's standing positions and also discuss current legislative bills.

K. Holter has been offered to serve on ASBO International's SFO Certification Commission as an ad-hoc member for 2022. The purpose of the commission is to create a viable, credible, and defensible certification program for school business officials. Most meetings are held through an on-line platform. One face-to-face meeting is held during ASBO's Annual Conference and Expo which will be held in Portland, OR in September.

Core Educational Cooperative Report

R. Summerville reported on the Core Coop meeting held on January 6, 2022.

Mid Central Educational Cooperative Report

No meeting was held.

Return to In-Person Instruction Plan

The administration is recommending the following changes to the current plan:

- Parents are not allowed to eat with their student(s)- School lunch programs are
 experiencing food shortages across the country. The administration wants to ensure that
 students receive enough to eat each day and do not want to cut into an already limited
 supply of food. With the current COVID climate and the Omicron variant running rampant,
 it is recommended to eliminate unnecessary visitors in the lunchroom.
- Contact tracing will not be conducted by the district.
- Update the appendix citing the latest CDC/SDDOH isolation and quarantine recommendations and to include a link to the SDDOH COVID isolation and quarantine online calculator. https://doh.sd.gov/COVID/Calculator/default.aspx

Motion H. VanDerWerff, seconded D. Starr approving the recommended changes to the Return to In-Person Instruction Plan. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Second Reading Procurement Plan for Child Nutrition Programs

The board of education gave second reading to the Procurement Plan for Child Nutrition Programs. Motion R. Varilek, seconded H. VanDerWerff approving and adopting the plan. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Second Reading Procurement Guide for Federal Awards

The board gave second reading to the Procurement Guide for Federal Awards. Motion D. Starr, seconded M. Petersen approving and adopting the Procurement Guide for Federal Awards. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

School Sanctioned Softball

The SDHSAA Executive Board has approved the sanctioning of girls softball. At the December School Board Meeting, Supt. Bailey was directed to survey all girls in grades 6-12 to determine interest in a school sanctioned softball program. Of the 56 responses received, 50% voted yes, 27% voted no, and 23% were unsure. State sanctioned softball will not begin until the Spring of 2023, but the SDHSAA is asking for a letter of intent from each district by February 1, 2022. The board questioned if signing the letter of intent committed them to participate in the program. That information was not made clear through SDHSAA. Motion R. Summerville, seconded M. Petersen signing the letter of intent indicating that Platte-Geddes School District planned to participate only if the intent does not commit the district to participate due to low participation or other unforeseen circumstances. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Approve Driver Education Instructor Contract for Ms. Kraft

Motion D. Starr, seconded R. Varilek approving the contract of Ms. Sara Kraft as Driver's Education Instructor at an hourly wage of \$18.50/hour for up to ten hours of prep time, thirty hours of classroom instruction, and six hours per student for behind-the-wheel instruction. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Set Driver Education Fees

Motion M. Petersen, seconded R. Summerville setting the fees for driver's education at \$190.00 for students attending Platte-Geddes School and \$240.00 for students not attending the Platte-Geddes School. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Out of State Travel Requests

Kathy Holter is considering attending the spring NAFIS Conference in Washington D.C. on March 13-15. Attending the conference is already within the administrative agreement, however past practice has been to have board approval for out of state travel.

Per negotiations, the school board approved Superintendent Bailey to attend the National Conference on Education in Nashville, TN on February 17-19.

Motion R. Summerville, seconded M. Petersen approving the out of state travel for K. Holter to the NAFIS Conference in Washington, DC and for Supt. Bailey to the AASA National Conference on Education in Nashville, TN. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Approve Open Enrollment.

The district has received an open enrollment request for a student that formerly attended Platte-Geddes and wishes to return to the district. Motion M. Petersen, seconded D. Staff approving the open enrollment application for one student. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Approve Elementary and High School Roof Replacement Materials Purchase

Site Logiq has secured pricing for roofing materials for the elementary and high school roof replacements via the Association of Educational Purchasing Agency. To address the long lead times, they are requesting permission to place the order now to ensure timely delivery of the materials. The order includes 480 Tremco—SG Securock .25"x4'x8' at \$66.90/each and one tapered kit at \$46,900.00. The freight charge is \$4,740.72 for a total cost of \$83,752.72. The ordered can be canceled up to the shipping date. Motion H. VanDerWerff, seconded R. Varilek approving the elementary and high school roof replacement materials purchase in the amount of \$83,752.72 through the Association of Educational Purchasing Agency, Contract #IFB #021-D. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Approve Elementary and High School HVAC Materials Purchase

Site Logiq received pricing on the mechanical equipment through Omnia Partners, a cooperative purchasing organization, from Trane Company for the high school and elementary school upgrades scheduled for this summer. They have reviewed these selections and pricing and recommend the pre-purchase for the following two proposals:

- Elementary: HVAC units, climate changer, fan section, hot water heater \$248,795.00. Omnia Co-op Contract Number USC 15-JLP-023
- High School: Performance climate changer, air handling units \$69,129.00. Omnia Co-op Conract Number USC 15-JLP-023

Any changes to the equipment order after next week will incur a 12% price increase. If updates to RTU-2 are made, then RTU-2 as a whole would see the price increase. The other equipment would not be affected if no changes are made. Equipment cancellations may only take place for one or two weeks following the order.

Motion R. Varilek, seconded M. Petersen approving the elementary and high school HVAC equipment purchases from Trane Company as advised. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Accept Resignation of Special Education Paraprofessional, Elizabeth Warejcka, and Advertise the Position

Motion R. Summerville, seconded D. Starr accepting the resignation of Elizabeth Warejcka as elementary paraprofessional and authorizing the administration to advertise the position to be filled as soon as possible. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.
