National Career Readiness Certification (NCRC)

win Cedars Juniors recently completed the National Career Readiness Certification (NCRC). NCRC is based on ACT WorkKeys research-based work skills assessments. To earn a NCRC certificate, an examinee must successfully complete three ACT WorkKeys assessments: Applied Mathematics, Locating Information, and Reading for Information. These assessments measure a range of essential work skills, including the ability to:

- Perform basic mathematic operations relevant to the workplace
- Read and understand documents commonly found in the workplace
- Find information presented in common workplace graphics
- Set up and solve complex work-related math problems
- Determine the relevance of written information to work-related tasks
- Apply information derived from graphics to work-related problems

Four levels of proficiency

The ACT NCRC is awarded at four levels, based on the scores achieved on the component assessments.

- Platinum: Scores of Level 6 or higher on all three exams
- Gold: Scores of Level 5 or higher on all three exams
- Silver: Scores of Level 4 or higher on all three exams
- Bronze: Scores of Level 3 or higher on all three exams

Benefits of the ACT NCRC

- Job seekers: A valuable work skills credential with the potential to improve career outcomes.
- Employers: A trusted indicator that, in combination with other selection tools, can improve hiring, training, or promotion decisions.
 - Students: A credential that helps students succeed in a variety of career pathways.

Twin Cedars Junior Class Performance

17% of the class scored Gold (all of these students were a point from scoring Platinum.)

41% of the class scored Silver.

17% of the class scored Bronze.

25% of the class did not score.

Juniors and Seniors will have the opportunity to take or re-take the NCRC on April 5.

The elementary completed its winter screening of student reading fluency and comprehension. Below are charts that compare the percentage of students at or above benchmark in fluency with our local education region and with the State of Iowa. One chart contains students in grades Kindergarten through 6th grade. The other chart reports just students in Kindergarten through 3rd grade. The Department of Education in

Iowa requires Twin Cedars to screen only K-3 students, but to more adequately meet the needs of our school, we screen all of the students.


