## Next Generation Science Standards

In 2016-2017, elementary and high school teachers will be learning about Iowa's new science standards, Next Generation Science. The students will absolutely love the new standards as the focus of lessons will be inquiry and discovery. Students will be involved in experimenting and predicting. Twin Cedars also received a STEM grant this year and has purchased several science kits. As the year progresses, I hope you hear from your students that they love science!

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## Differentiated Accountability

Recently Twin Cedars Elementary received its status in regards to Early Literacy Implementation. Twin Cedars, along with all schools in the state, were scored in two categories: Assessment and Universal Instruction. Within these two categories, three ratings are given: Universal, Targeted, Intensive.

In Assessment, Twin Cedars was one of 24 school rated as Universal. This means Twin Cedars is doing a great job assessing and progress monitoring students in accordance with state guidelines.

In Universal Instruction, Twin Cedars was rated as Targeted. Of the 300 school receiving statuses, 253 schools were rated as Targeted. In order to receive an Universal rating we need to raise our FAST proficiency from $66 \%$ to $79 \%$. We have several initiatives to help us reach this standard.
