 - The Illinois Student Assistance Commission (ISAC) presents this important recognition of academic achievement to exceptional Illinois high school students annually. This year, more than 17,340 honorees join the other outstanding students who have been honored since the designation was first introduced in 1958. Congratulations on this well-deserved honor!

Recent Network Issues

- The issues have been caused by what's known as a DDoS or Distributed Denial-of-Service attack.
 - In a nutshell, what that means is that our network is getting bombarded with traffic, so much so that it causes it to overload and shut down for brief periods of time.
 - The first attacks were on December 15th and 16th, then again January 4th, 6th, 7th, and 10th.
 - All indications suggested these DDoS attacks were being directly and repeatedly targeted at us specifically.
 - Please note that these attacks are NOT meant to intrude our network or steal any information, they are simply designed to cause disruptions in connectivity.
- We spent countless hours on the phone with cyber security experts, our internet service provider, and other knowledgeable resources to determine any changes we could possibly make to thwart these attacks.
 - Fortunately, we haven't seen any attacks since Monday, January 10th.
- Internet Service Provider change
 - As a result of our recent DDoS issues, we decided that it is necessary to make an immediate change in our Internet Service Provider.
 - We will be switching from NIUNet to the Illinois Century Network (ICN).
 - Benefits of connecting to ICN
 - No cost to us
 - Annual savings of \$14000
 - Additional security services,
 - o Auto distributed denial of service mitigation,
 - More firewall protection, and
 - Cisco Umbrella for security and content filtering
 - The switch to ICN is currently in the works and should take place within the next week.



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STAFFING SHORTAGE PLAN

PART I: RECRUITMENT OF NEW EMPLOYEES (specifically classroom and 1:1 aides)

- Create a new salary schedule with increased starting wages.
- Reimburse new hires for costs incurred in obtaining proper certification necessary to work for MCUD #6. Reimbursement would be given at the completion of the school year provided that the employee:
 - Submitted receipts for cost incurred;
 - Finished the school year in good standing with the District;
 - o Completed the year with an attendance record of 90% of above
- One time signing bonus of (bonuses to be paid at the conclusion of the year if criteria above is met):
 - \$500 for Classroom aides
 - \$750 for 1:1 aides
 - \$250 for all other non-certified position
- Attendance incentive of \$1000 for all non-certified personnel who finish their contractual year with an attendance rate of 97% or above.
- Tuition reimbursement similar to reimbursement schedule for certified staff members.
- Actively post job openings in various outlets including social media and print media.

PART II: RETAINMENT OF CURRENT EMPLOYEES

- Service credit for years in the district on the newly created salary schedule.
- Attendance incentive of \$1000 for all non-certified personnel who finish their contractual year with an attendance rate of 97% or above.
- Longevity bonus for reaching employment milestones of:

5 Years: \$500
10 Years: \$750
15 Years: \$1000
20 Years: \$1250
25 Years: \$1500

Tuition reimbursement similar to reimbursement schedule for certified staff members.

Dish Machine Purchase Proposal

Thank you for this opportunity to present Performance Foodservice outright purchase of a new CMA 180-S high temp single rack dish machine and a new CMA EST-44 high temp conveyor dish machine.

CMA 180-S single rack purchase price is \$7771.00 (excluding sales tax and freight)

CMA EST-44 conveyor purchase price is \$11,318.00 (excluding sales tax and freight)

The CMA 180 single rack can work at both schools with very little adjustments. The CMA EST-44 conveyor is for the high school to replace the Blakeslee conveyor dish machine. There will need to be new custom vent cowl built by a local manufacturer since this is work that our technicians don't do. We can help source this custom work to be done and get a cost proposal drawn up for approval.

If this proposal is approved a purchase agreement will need to be signed. Once all paperwork is submitted and approved, we will order the machine. When the machine arrives, we will contact you and set a time and date to come in and replace your current machine and put in a place of your choosing to dispose of. We will install the new machine at no charge to you.

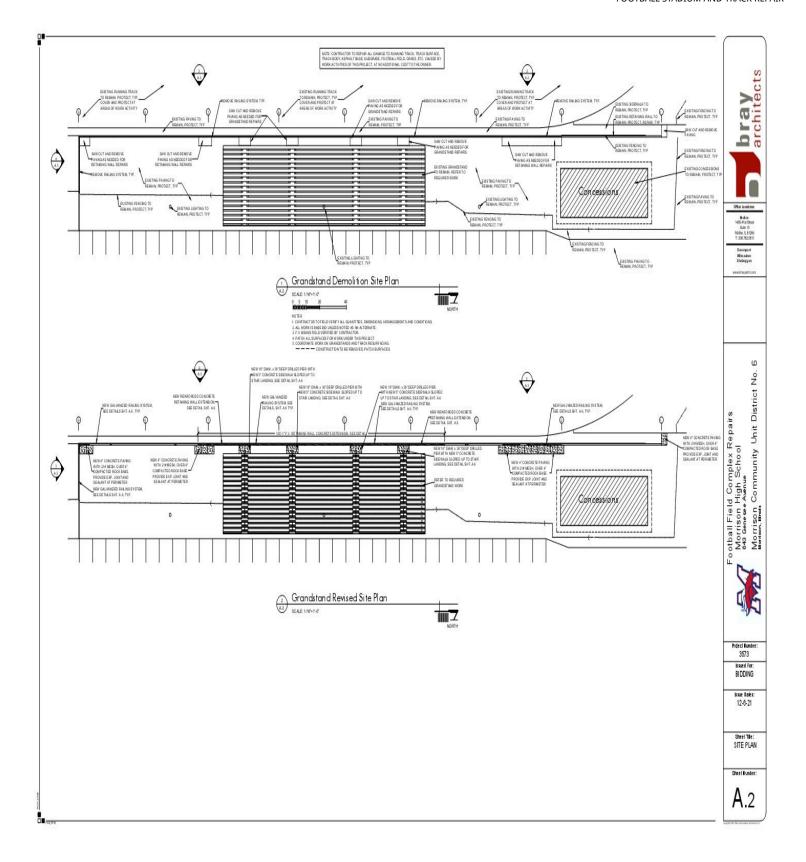
We do ask that all appropriate ventilation hood, plumbing and electrical are in place prior to installation. We will offer routine service on all machines as long as the product purchase minimum is active.

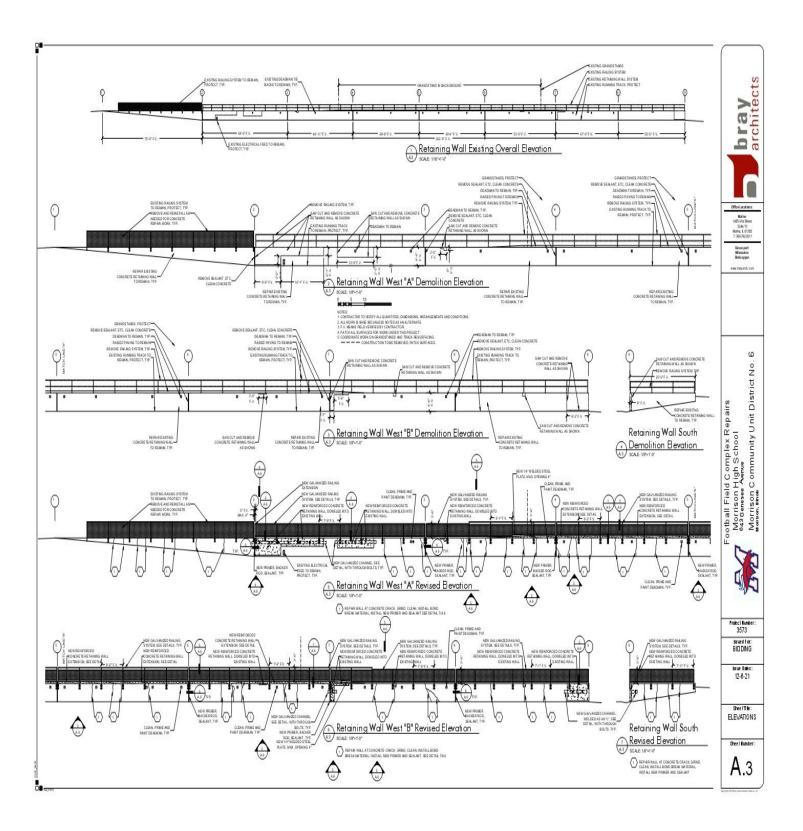
