NEW BUSINESS

Superintendent Scott Kinney presented the following recommendations to the Board

7.1 Resolution of intent to increase non-voted levy

Stacy Conrow-Ververis motioned to open agenda item 7.1Dan Hazlett seconded the motion Mr.Kinney recommends the Board adopt a resolution to impose an increase in a non-voted levy that includes, at a minimum, the estimated number of increased or decreased mills to be imposed and the estimated increased or decreased revenue to be raised compared to non-voted levies under(1)(a) through (1)(e) imposed in the current school fiscal year and, based on the district's taxable valuation most recently certified by the Department of Revenue under 15-10-202, the estimated impacts of the increase or decrease on a home valued at \$100,000 and a home valued at \$200,000 in the following funds: Tuition, Adult Education, Building Reserve, Transportation and Bus Depreciation, all in favor, **motion carries 4-0**

7.2 Senior Trip Request

Shane Quick motioned to open agenda item 7.2, Dan Hazlett seconded the motion. Mr. Bishop requested the Board consider the 2020 senior class's request for their annual overnight trip in early May. Mr. Kinney recommends the Board approve Mr. Bishop's request as presented, all in favor, **motion** carries 4-0.

7.3. Set negotiations committees

Stacy Conrow-Ververis motioned to open agenda item 7.3, Shane Quick seconded the motion. Every year the district needs to form two negotiating committees (Certified & Classified) to meet with the SEA to negotiate collective bargaining agreements for the upcoming school year. Mr. Kinney recommends that the Board form two negotiating committees as presented; Dan Hazlett and Shane Quick agreed to negotiate with Classified and Michelle Parkin and Stacy Conrow-Ververis will be negotiated with Certified, all in favor, motion carries 4-0.

7.4 Purchase stop arms for buses

Stacy Conrow-Ververis motioned to open agenda item 7.4, Shane Quick seconded the motion. Mr. Labbe informed the Board that it was discussed at the last Transportation meeting that there is a need for extended stop arms on the four route buses, as our divers being passed continues to be a safety issue. Mr. Kinney recommends that the Board accept Mr. Labbe's request to outfit our buses with extended stop arms as presented, all in favor, **motion carries 4-0.**

7.5 Surplus bid award

Dan Hazlett motioned to open agenda item 7.5; Stacy Conrow-Ververis seconded the motion. In February the district advertised the sale of the high school shed for surplus sale Mr. Kinney recommends that the Board award the sale of the high school shed to the highest bidder as presented, all in favor, **motion carries 4-0.**

7.6 Gear Up overnight trip request to Glacier

Stacy Conrow-Ververis motioned to open agenda item 7.6, Shane Quick seconded the motion. Gear Up is requesting to take the 8th grade class of 29 students, along with 4 chaperones and a bus driver to Glacier April 27-29. Mr. Kinney recommends the Board to approve trip request as presented, all in favor, **motion carries 4-0.**

7.7 Gear Up overnight trip request to Teton Science School- Jackson, WY

Stacy Conrow-Ververis motioned to open agenda item 7.7, Dan Hazlett seconded the motion. Gear Up is requesting to take the 7th grade class along with 2 chaperones and a bus driver to Teton Science School in Jackson, WY March 16-19. Mr. Kinney recommends the Board to approve trip request as presented, all in favor, **motion carries 4-0**.

INFORMATIONAL/DISCUSSION

- 8.1 Jeff Schultz updated the Board on the upcoming Greece trip March21st-March29th. He has been in contract with EF Tours over the COVID-19 concern and they are willing to honor the "Peace of Mind" insurance which is purchased by each traveler, should we find the need to do so. They gave three options which include: Option 1: Move the travel dates. Option 2: Move the destination. Option 3: Forfeit this year's trip all together and receive a future travel voucher. He said after much discussion, the group still feels comfortable going at this point and should they get over there and have things drastically change, EF Tour will send them back to the United States within 24 hours. Greece is currently at a Level 1 travel restriction which is the lowest on the scale.
- 8.2 Mr. Kinney presented the COVID-19 update and informed the Board that he contacted Shawn Bubb with MSGIA which then had his executive director, Lance Melton draft an "Acknowledgement of Risk Associated with Participation in Student Trip Involving International Travel" document.
