All-Star Game Highlights by Cyclones:

1963 – QB Ronnie South completed all four of his pass attempts for 126 yards, an average of 31.5 yards per attempt and per completion. Both marks are still All-Star game records.

1964 – Noseguard Bobby Haulmark selected the game’s outstanding lineman.

1993 – Defensive end Chris Goodman named defensive player of the game.

2002 – Defensive end Horacio Colen selected defensive player of the game.

2003 – QB Landon Leach was named the game’s MVP. He completed 13 of 14 passes for 235 yards, breaking the old passing yardage record of 233 yards set in the 1967 All-Star game by Darrell Hatchett of North Little Rock High. The West All-Stars won 38-24 at Razorback Stadium.

2006 – QB Eli Cranor completed seven of 11 passes for 83 yards and one TD in leading the West All-Stars to a 20-3 win. Cranor was selected as the game’s MVP. Based on all-star rules, if one team is up by 14 points or more in the second half, the team trailing maintains possession of the ball even after a score unless it has to punt. His team leading 17-0 at the half, this limited Cranor’s playing time in the second half.

2016 - QB Cale Fulsom started for the West and completed 16 of 28 passes for 160 yards, threw a 19-yard touchdown pass to Bentonville's Hadley Gregg. Fulsom connected with WR Cable Stokes on 2 passes.

2017 - QB Ryan Talley threw an 18-yard touchdown pass on a reverse to Malvern quarterback Demias Jimmerson. The West cruised to a 52-21 victory.
