Face Coverings	 Face coverings will be required per Board of Education Rule Respect others' decision, whether wearing a face covering or not, and social distancing when possible Face coverings will be made available
Arrival	 Self-Screening All employees and students have a shared responsibility to daily self-screen for any COVID symptoms prior to reporting to school. This will be done in accordance with the district's Self-Screening Process. Resources will be provided to staff and families Transportation Face coverings are required on district transportation in accordance to CDC guidelines and our District Reopening plan. If parents choose to exempt their child from wearing a face covering while on district transportation, there is a document that will be provided to you and will need to be completed. Busses will unload 1 at a time in order to avoid "bottlenecks" at the building entrance.
Breakfast/Lunch	Students will bring their belongings to their locker Hand sanitizer will be provided in the cafeteria Finger scanners will not be used Breakfast - Students will maintain social distancing while in the cafeteria - 6 people per table (3 per side where marked) - May also eat in the main hallway (Respect Social Distancing) Middle School Lunch - 6 students per table (3 per side where marked) - Students will go outside when done eating when weather permits - Students remain in the cafeteria or may walk in the gymnasium when weather does not permit going outside High School Lunch - There will be two release times based on classroom placement to allow for lesser lines in the cafeteria - 12:28 Mr. Beck, Mrs. Lambert, Ms. Mohelnitzky, Ms. King, Mrs Hoiby - 12:32 Mrs. Freeman, Mrs Grenfell, Mrs. Gatzow, Mr. Uren, Mrs. Smith - Open campus with parent/guardian permission - Following areas may be utilized

Absences must be reported to the office in accordance the attendance policy Hall Passes Hall passes will not be used Students will sign out of the classroom for accountability Hand sanitizer will be available in every classroom Teaching of online platforms at all grades is important in case we experience a closure again or a student is out but well enough to learn. Teachers will create a 3-6 ft space between their teaching space and the nearest student Plexiglass shields will be placed on the teacher's desk Students will be seated with respect to social distance when possible Any shared materials will be cleaned between uses Classrooms will be disinfected at the end of each day
Isolation Room for Covid-19 Symptomatic Students	If a student is symptomatic at school, they will be isolated in the following spaces until a parent/guardian picks them up. - Sick Room - Room 303
Dismissal Visitors	 Middle School 3:23, High School 3:26 Only essential visitors/vendors will be allowed to enter the building

Given the widespread transmission of COVID-19, Northeast Wisconsin Technical College (NWTC) is committed to providing a high-quality and safe student educational experience while ensuring the safety of our students and our workforce in alignment with the CDC published guidelines.

- Physical distancing is required. Stay at least 6 feet apart and do not gather in groups.
- A face covering/mask that covers both the mouth and nose is required to be worn by all students when on campus except when eating or drinking. Wearing a face covering helps protect others in case you are infected but don't have symptoms.
- When Face coverings are removed, they should be removed without touching eyes, mouth, and nose.
- Wash hands each time the mask is touched or adjusted, put on or removed.
- Cloth face coverings should be washed daily, ideally using a washing machine.

Students not following these guidelines will be asked by faculty and staff to do so. Failure to comply will result in a request for the student to leave the campus and may result in disciplinary action for violation of the NWTC Student Code of Conduct.

As a summary, please inform your students that as part of the plan students and staff will be required to wear face coverings in the hallways, classrooms and lab areas. masks." Students who are not medically able to tolerate a mask will be asked to provide documentation.

In addition to enhanced cleaning and disinfection of the school, we also will be teaching and reinforcing good handwashing and other hygiene practices. Students will be asked to disinfect their desks, tools, and other surfaces at the start of class. We also ask that parents and students do a self-screening for symptoms and stay home if they are present. We will be working with our local health department on protocols for students and staff should anyone be exposed to or contract Covid-19. I will share additional information with you as it becomes available.
