## **CONNECTIONS GOALS**


- Children are ready for school and sustained development and learning.

## **SERVICE AREA**

The USD 489 Early Childhood Connections program provides center and home-based services. The USD 489 Early Childhood Complex is located at 2501 13th Street in Hays, KS and houses seven full-day preschool classrooms, three full-day EHS childcare classrooms, program staff and the USD 489 preschool classroom. A full day classroom is located at Simpson Elementary in Russell, Kansas. A classroom at Washington Elementary in Ellis, Kansas provides a morning and afternoon session of preschool.

Home based preschool, Early Head Start Home Visitation and Community Child Care services are provided in Ellis, Rush, Rooks and Russell Counties. Parents as Teachers services are provided in the Hays (USD 489) and Russell (USD 407) school district.

### **0 to 3 PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS**

#### **Parents as Teachers**

**Description:** Parents as Teachers is a parent and child development program that serves families throughout pregnancy until your child enters Kindergarten. Parent Educators provide monthly personal home visits and regular screenings to make sure your child is healthy, safe and developing on track.

**Eligibility:** Open to all pregnant women and families with children birth to Kindergarten living in the service area.

Service Area: Serving families in the Hays (USD 489) and Russell (USD 407) school district.

**Staff:** PAT has two full-time Parent Educators and one 1 Coordinator.

Funding: Kansas State Department of Education + local match from USD 489 (Hays) and USD 407 (Russell)

#### **Early Head Start**

**Description:** EHS serves pregnant mothers as well as children through age three. Parents have the option of center-based, family childcare or home-based services. Parent Educators provide weekly personal home visits and regular screenings to make sure your child is healthy, safe and developing on track. Center-based and family childcare providers offer full day services. A Family Support Worker provides monthly visits to support family goals. The primary focus of the program is child development, parenting to strengthen the family and self-sufficiency.

**Eligibility:** Open to pregnant women and families with children birth to 3 with income eligibility.

**Service Area:** Serving home-based families in Rooks, Ellis, Russell and Rush Counties. Center-Based childcare is available in Hays. Family childcare options exist in Hays, Ellis, Russell and Gorham.

**Staff:** EHS has 6 Parent Educators, 3 EHS Lead Teachers, 10 Teacher Assistants, 1 Family Support Worker and 2 Coordinators.

**Funding:** Federal Early Head Start, Kansas Early Head Start Home Visitation and Kansas Early Head Start Childcare





#### 3 to 5 PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

#### **Connections 3 to 5 Preschool**

**Description:** Connections 3 to 5 Preschool is a comprehensive, child development program concerned with the health, education and welfare of its participants. Services are provided in the areas of: education, special education, nutrition, medical, dental and mental health and social services. Center-based preschool classrooms are available in Hays, Ellis and Russell. The program provides 8 full day classrooms (7.5 hours of class time) and 2 half day sessions (3.5 hours of class time), four days a week. Home-based preschool services are also available.

**Eligibility:** Families are eligible through Head Start criteria and Preschool-aged at-risk criteria which include: single parent family, teen parents, no parental high school diploma or GED, limited English proficiency, developmental delays, or eligibility for free lunch.

**Service Area:** Families living in Ellis, Rooks, Rush and Russell Counties.

**Staff:** The Preschool program has 11 Teachers, 18 Teacher Assistants, 4 Family Advocates, 1 Bilingual Assistant and 2 Coordinators.

Funding: Federal Head Start, Preschool-Aged At-Risk, Kansas 4 Year Old At-Risk and Early Childhood Block Grant

Program wide, Connections has 1 Director, 1 nurse, 3 administrative staff and 2 coordinators.



The chart below compares results of the Fall 2021 and Spring 2021 school readiness goals.









## **2020-2021 FINANCIAL INFORMATION**

Early Childhood Connections secures funding for its programs through a variety of state and federal grants as shown below.




The largest expenditure in the Early Childhood Connections budget, is by far personnel expenses which includes salary and fringe for staff. Expenses by category are shown below.

### PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Parents, as their child's most important advocate, are encouraged to be engaged in their child's education. A variety of opportunities are provided to encourage parent participation in the Connections program. Parent engagement activities are free to attend and include free childcare as well as a meal or snack.

**Daddy and Me Day:** This activity is designed to encourage fathers and male role models to be more involved with their child. Varied, structured activities are provided for adults to interact with their child and have fun together. Moms and females are welcome!

**Family Activity Night:** This event provides a free activity for parents and children to do together.

**Playgroups:** These events offer a time for parents of children ages 0 to 3 the opportunity for supervised, creative and social play.

### **AWARDS & HONORS**

#### **Kansas Head Start Support Staff Member of the Year**

**Lizzette Alvarez**, "Liz" is a Bilingual Teacher Assistant for the Connections program . She provides translation services for all the 3 to 5 classrooms as well as family services.

Teacher Jean Hertel says of Alvarez, "More important than simple translation services, is her innate gift with children that puts them at ease and makes them feel safe. Students who come to my classroom not speaking English are typically overwhelmed and scared. I believe it is due to her intervention that students pick up English so quickly."



#### **Kansas Head Start Excellence in Community Service**

The **CrossPoint Hays Church** (CrossPoint) is a valuable support to Connections family. Their contributions include: frequent use of their facility for staff meetings and program events, sprucing up our outdoor campus, support of Connections families with Christmas gifts and support of staff member morale through delivery of snacks and other morale boosters such as free gift certificates to local eating establishments.

Connections Director, Donna Hudson-Hamilton says of CrossPoint, "I can't say enough about how welcoming and neighborly they have been towards the program staff and children. Their actions are genuinely from a servant's heart."




#### PARTICIPANT FEEDBACK
