WHAT WE ARE LEARNING

Math

- In math we are naming and identifying fractions on a number line. We will also begin learning about equivalent fractions this week.

Science

- We will take our test on rocks on Tuesday, and will begin learning about different types of soil this week.

Social Studies:

- This week we are learning about the exploration through the New World, specifically what would become the United States of America. Students should bring their notebooks home to go over their notes/foldables each night.

Reading/Writing

- We are finishing up our Mystery Unit. This week we are finding out that the strategies we learned for reading mystery books are the same ones we should use when reading any type of fiction books.
