ANTIOCH JUNIOR WOMAN'S CLUB "COMMUNITY" SCHOLARSHIP- (1) \$1,000

scholarship to a District 117 female student planning to attend a 2- or 4-year college or university. Strong consideration given to level of volunteerism, activities, and community service involvement. Additional consideration given to financial need. GPA must be a minimum of 3.0.

#### ANTIOCH JUNIOR WOMAN'S CLUB "TERRY KOROM" LEADERSHIP

**SCHOLARSHIP** - (1) \$1,000 scholarship to a District 117 female student planning to attend a 2- or 4-year college or university. Requires student to have held leadership positions in academic and community organizations. Additional consideration given to financial need. GPA must be a minimum of 3.0.

ANTIOCH WOMAN'S CLUB SCHOLARSHIP- (1) \$1,500 scholarship will be awarded to an LCHS senior residing in District 117 and planning to attend CLC or a 4 year college or university.

ANTIOCH WOMAN'S CLUB "LILLIE PETTY" SCHOLARSHIP - (1) \$1,000 Lillie Petty Scholarship for a student from LCHS or ACHS entering the educational field.

ANTIOCH WOMAN'S CLUB VOCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP (1) \$1,000 Scholarship for a student from LCHS or ACHS pursing an occupation in the trades.

#### ANTIOCH WOMAN'S CLUB DOROTHY VOLKERT SCHOLARSHIP (1) \$1,000

Scholarship for a District 117 senior who will be attending any college/jr college, any field or vocation, etc.

#### DISTRICT 117 VIKING FOOTBALL AND CHEERLEADING SCHOLARSHIP - (1)

\$1,000 scholarship will be offered in each Category to a student who participated in either the Viking Football or Cheerleading program for at least 2 years in grammar and/or middle school. Applicant must have a minimum GPA of a 3.0 and be plan planning to enroll at a 2/4 year college, trade or technical school. THE JEFFREY HOKE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP - (1) \$500 scholarship will be offered to a senior percussion student planning to enroll in a 4 year university/college fulltime and planning to major in the field of music. The student must have a minimum GPA of a 2.5. (1) Letter of recommendation must be included from the student's music instructor.

JIM CORRIGAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP - (1) \$3,000 scholarship awarded to a LCHS student, who plans to pursue a study in the humanities or education field. Applicants must provide evidence of college enrollment, maintain a 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale, and indicate financial need.

**JOHN M. CUNNEA BUSINESS SCHOLARSHIP -** (1) \$2,000 scholarship will be awarded to a student planning on studying business at a 2 or 4 year school. Applicants are judged based on their application and a transcript of grades, with varying emphasis on academics, leadership and financial need.

**LAKES AREA LINDENHURST KIWANIS CLUB -** Various scholarships will be awarded to seniors living in the 60046 zip code who will be attending college or vocational schools to pursue a career related to children (Education, Pediatrics, etc). Selection based on academic achievement, school activities, community service and financial need. Special consideration will be given to students who have worked or volunteered with young people in the community.

**LCHS EDUCATION ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP** – (1) \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded to a senior planning to become a teacher.

**LCHS STUDENT COUNCIL LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP** – (2) \$500 scholarships seniors with a minimum of 2 years service to Student Council. The students must be in good standing and be an active leader in Student Council. Scholarship may be used for a 2 or 4 year college, university or trade school.

**NORTHERN ILLINOIS CONSERVATION SCHOLARSHIP -** (1) - \$1,000.00 scholarship awarded to a student enrolled in District 117 who is interested in an environmentally based degree. Student should be enrolled in a 4-year college. Applicant will need to write a 500-word essay stating how his/her degree will benefit the environment.

**STATE BANK OF THE LAKES CLC SCHOLARSHIP -** (1) \$2,500 scholarship will be awarded to a Lakes Community High School student for the purpose of supporting their college education at The College of Lake County. The award is to be used for tuition and book expenses and will be provided in two year increment payments of \$1,250 each year of attendance not to exceed 2 years. A 2.0 GPA must be maintained while at The College of Lake County.

**BE THE GOOD SCHOLARSHIP -** (1) \$1,000 scholarship awarded to a student planning to attend post-high school community college or university.

**FIRST RESPONDERS SCHOLARSHIP -** (2) \$1,000 scholarships awarded to graduating seniors who will be studying Public Safety, Fire Fighting, Emergency Medical Care, Nursing etc.

THE BUTTERFLY EFFECT OF MADDOX J. Winners will be invited and encouraged to attend major Foundation events and fundraisers throughout the year to share their experience in the scholarship program.
