What is the Project?

Phase 1: The current grass field is being updated to a rubberized field turf. This project will cut down on long term

maintenance and provide an updated surface for our athletes, band and student body.

<u>Phase 2:</u> Update the restroom facilities and the concession area to allow for additional bathrooms and space.

Phase 3: Complete a new entry with replacement of the chain link fence, walkway, and ticket facility. The new grand


Important Notes from Transportation Director Ryan Price

Kindergarten/Young 5s Special Bus Information

When delivering Kindergarten/Y5 students home, someone must be seen or the driver will bring the student back to South School. K/Y5 will not be dropped off if the driver does not see anyone home!

Two Pleasant View Estate Pick-Ups & Drop Offs

As shown on the bus schedules, there will be two buses stopping at Pleasant View Estates both in the AM and PM - one for MS/HS students (#7) and another for Elementary students (#5). Stops have been scheduled so that the younger children are to be picked up first and dropped off second so that the MS/HS students can be there with them when they leave and arrive.



NEW STUDENT REGISTRATION

Parents of students new to the district may register their children at the appropriate school building anytime beginning August 4.

Parents should bring the following items:

- The student's original birth certificate
- Immunization record
- Residency Documents (2)

You must provide ONE of the following:

- ⇒ Purchase Agreement (if closing occurred within the last 6 months)
- ⇒ Lease Agreement
- ⇒ Rental Agreement with name and property address of the person enrolling the student (or)
- ⇒ Current property tax bill with name and address

And you must ALSO provide ONE of the following:

- ♦ Michigan Drivers License or State ID with current Watervliet In-District Address
- Current* utility bill in the name and address of person enrolling the student (gas, electric, water or cable bill only). Mailing address MUST match the service address
- ♦ Current U.S. Passport or Michigan Voter ID Card

*A current bill covers a service period ending within 30 days of the current date.

PRESCHOOL REGISTRATION

Watervliet Public Schools' Great Start Readiness Program free preschool is staffed with a full-time certified teacher. and a full-time teaching assistant who provide our littlest Panthers with learning experiences that get them ready for kindergarten. To qualify for this program, students must be four years of age on or before September 1, **2022.** Eligibility is also based on additional factors (including rural residency, single-parent home, teenage parent, family income level, etc.). Transportation to and from the full day session must be provided by the parent. PBIS

Positive Behavior Intervention System will be implemented at the start of this year in the middle school. As students they have seen this in the elementary schools and now it will follow them in the middle school - so the 3 basic principles of Be Safe, Be Respectful, and Be Responsible will be district wide.

PBIS frameworks can significantly reduce disruptive behaviors, bullying, and help facilitate the learning process. It will also lead to better student engagement, better attendance and overall increases in test scores. Most importantly, it can create a positive learning culture where students feel safe, secure and enjoy learning. PBIS focuses more on what students "can do" vs. what students "can't do". Instead of a list of "do's" and "don'ts", it focuses on behavioral expectations that keep students safe. It builds responsibility and it encourages respect.




Summer is a great time for students to unwind and play in the summer heat. Traditionally for many students, it has also been a time to catch up on learning missed during the school year in summer school. Many districts have only focused on that important task of addressing the needs of the students who are struggling. Watervliet is different.


Watervliet recognizes that summer can also be an opportunity for students who want to learn and have fun doing it. This summer, we took advantage of a federal grant that focuses on expanding student exposure to coding. Our solution was to have a summer school program specifically for robotics. Robotics is the perfect combination of hands-on and coding so that students really see their code in action and working.

Our program focused on students leaving 3rd through 5th grade and ran for a month, Monday - Thursday, for about 3 hours. Students built their robots with instructions they had or could potentially create their own. From there, the students could use an online interface to create the code that the robot would follow. Students could then make adjustments either to their robot or code, if needed. By the end of the summer session, students were racing their robots against each other. Not only were they learning, but they were having fun doing so.

It's opportunities like these that we plan to continue bringing to our students so they can further their learning above and beyond the classroom and to set them up for future success!

Important: Watervliet Public Schools is approved to offer FREE MEALS to all children 18 and younger for the 2022-2023 school year.

Student Nutrition Needs

Watervliet Schools Nutrition Services Department makes changes for students with a documented disability such as, food anaphylaxis (severe food allergy), celiac disease, diabetes and cerebral palsy as directed by a Recognized Medical Authority. For other medical, dietary or special needs and requests, the School Nutrition Program may be able to make changes on a case-by-case basis.

Special Nutrition Needs and Disabilities.

The law describes a disability as "A person with a disability is a person who has a physical or mental impairment which substantially limits one or more major life activities, and has a record of such impairment" (USDA Food and Nutrition Service, 2001).

<u>Please remember</u>, a signed physician statement is required to be on file with the School Nutrition Program before making any disability-based change to a student's meal. **This medical statement must be updated with the School Nutrition Program whenever there is a change in your child's restrictions.** We cannot make changes based on parent or student requests.

Each special nutrition need request must be supported by a statement, signed by a recognized medical authority, which explains the food substitution that is requested.

A recognized medical Authority defined as:

Physician

Physician Assistant

Nurse Practitioner

Other professionals specified by the state Agency

The medical statement must include:

an identification of the medical or other special dietary condition which restricts the child's diet the food or foods to be omitted from the child's diet

the food or choice of foods to be substituted

Other Medical or Dietary Reasons for Special Nutrition Needs that may be considered.

The student's medical physician may consider lactose intolerance, gluten intolerance or weight control with the written and signed request.

Personal preferences:

Other personal requests such as vegetarian or "food dislikes" do not fall under the USDA guidelines. As children grow their tastes change and should be encouraged to try foods that are new or prepared differently than they are accustomed to.






Panther Athletics enters the 2022-23 school year on the heals of an outstanding 2021-22.
