What Makes a Good School Culture?

Watervliet Public Schools is blessed to serve a supportive community where families want to live and where the school system has served as a central hub of learning, growth, and community pride. This would not be possible without a strong and vibrant school culture that values high expectations, and a safe and supportive learning environment. An environment where trust, accountability, and respect are held in high regard.

Our school tagline has long been *Working Together to Keep Us Together!* This simple statement exemplifies the power of a school culture where the entire community works together to build a school where not only the skills and talents imparted to students are valued, but the community is made enhanced and the bonds that keep us together are strengthened. But what are the things that make a school culture? What elements and climate are necessary for such a culture to grow and thrive?

When considering this, I am reminded of the Parable of The Sower. In this parable, four types of soil are described. Each soil is imparted with knowledge and lessons - described as seeds.

The first is the soil by the road, where the seeds "fall by the wayside" - we might say, they fall through the cracks. They are not tended to and eventually are trampled and devoured by birds.

The second soil is rocky and unprepared, not nurturing. Here, the seeds may spring up, but they soon are lost because they lack water and nourishment.

The third soil is filled with weeds - resentment, selfishness, and unproductive behaviors. Even when the seeds are nurtured, the toxicity of the environment will choke out the good seed and fail to produce a crop.

The final soil is rich and nourishing - a place where the seed is nurtured and tended to; where expectations AND support work in harmony to provide a safe, supportive, and accountable environment. In this soil, the seeds grow and produce a good crop.

And so it is with a good school culture! Both school and community are needed to work together to tend to our school culture - creating "good soil" for our learners. When the farmer, farmhands, and neighbors tend to the soil by tilling, fertilizing, watering, and removing toxicity and weeds, a good crop is assured! We will realize great results in the form of high expectations, strong achievement, and a stronger community. When we ALL commit to working together to nurture our school culture, our students will certainly succeed!

Watervliet Public Schools has always enjoyed a strong school culture. But as any farmer knows, the soil can change over time. Innovation, intervention, renewal, and investment are needed when circumstances change. We are never done nurturing the soil. Thank you, Watervliet School Community, for working with us and for helping us continue our work at building a school culture that produces a "good crop" and that helps us strengthen our wonderful small community!

You must provide ONE of the following:

⇒ Purchase Agreement (if closing occurred within the last 6 months), Lease Agreement, Rental Agreement with the name and property address of the person enrolling the student, or a current property tax bill with name and address

And you must ALSO provide ONE of the following:

⇒ Michigan Drivers License or State ID with current Watervliet In-District Address, Current utility bill in the name and address of person enrolling the student (gas, electric, water or cable bill only). Mailing address MUST match the service address, or Current U.S. Passport or Michigan Voter ID Card

Spring Wrap-Up



New Ticket Prices



2023-2024 individual event admission for Watervliet Public Schools and all other SAC schools has been set at \$6 for high school events and \$4 for middle school events. Watervliet will admit students free to middle school games.

This is the first admission price increase since 2006. Officials' fee Increases and other operating cost increases throughout the league have necessitated the price increase.

For home games, we continue to encourage Panther fans to purchase athletic passes in advance. If you attend games regularly, these passes can save you a significant amount of money. As always, Senior Citizen passes are issued free of charge, and pre-school children are admitted to events for free.

The Watervliet Athletic Department encourages Panther fans to attend events and support our Panther athletes. In order to make this more economical, we offer several admission options in addition to single event ticketing

- ⇒ 2023-2024 All Season Family Pass: \$175 for a family of four. May include up to two adults living in the same household (\$25 for each additional school age dependent child added to a Family Pass). Pass may be used at both HS & MS Events.
 - ⇒ Single Person All Season Pass: \$75
 - ⇒ Adult Punch Pass: \$40 for 10 events (save \$2 per HS event attended)
 - ⇒ Student Punch Pass: \$30 for 10 events (save \$3 per HS event attended)
 - ⇒ Senior Pass: Free to Seniors age 62+

Senior Passes, Punch Passes and Family Passes may be used at WHS/WMS regular season home events throughout the school year. They are not valid for tournaments, or post-season games. Multiple individuals may use one Punch Pass. Senior passes will be honored at all SAC schools.

All Passes are available in the athletics office located in the Watervliet High School building

Note: Family Passes may be paid for in installments as long as the total is fully paid by the October 31.

School Breakfast: What Families Need to Know

Breakfast plays an important role in our productive learning environment. Over the past several years, new research has shown a positive link between breakfast, learning and nutrition. However, many students come to school without eating breakfast. Thankfully, our district offers a free breakfast to all students, but because of family schedules, students may arrive late with not much time to eat, or a preference to be with friends instead of eating breakfast once they arrive at school. Programs like classroom breakfast grab and go breakfast or second chance breakfast can significantly increase the number of students that eat breakfast.

Eating Breakfast at School Leads to Better Student Performance *

<u>Please remember</u>, a signed physician statement is required to be on file with the School Nutrition Program before making any disability-based change to a student's meal.

This medical statement must be updated with the School Nutrition

Program whenever there is a change in your child's restrictions. We cannot make changes based on parent or student requests.

Each special nutrition need request must be supported by a statement, signed by a recognized medical authority, which explains the food substitution that is requested.

Personal preferences:

Other personal requests such as vegetarian or "food dislikes" do not fall under the USDA guidelines. As children grow their tastes change and should be encouraged to try foods that are new or prepared differently than they are accustomed to.

Watervliet Public Schools November 7, 2023 Bond Proposal Frequently Asked Questions & Answers

Watervliet Public Schools voters will consider a school bond proposal on the November 7, 2023 election ballot.

PROPOSED BOND PROJECT SCOPE INFORMATION

What is a bond proposal and how can funds from a bond be spent?

A bond proposal is how a public school district can ask its voters for authorization to borrow money and levy taxes to pay for capital expenditures. Voter-approved bond funds can be spent on items like new construction, additions, remodeling, site improvements, athletic facilities, playgrounds, furnishings, equipment, and technology. Funds raised through the sale of bonds cannot be used on operational expenses such as employee salaries and benefits, school supplies, and textbooks. Bond funds must be kept separate from operating funds and must be audited by an independent auditing firm, pursuant to State law.

What are the key projects in this bond proposal?

This bond proposal focuses on three key areas:

Safety and Security

- New secure building entrance at the Middle School
- Classroom door hardware upgrades
- New security doors
- Parking lot improvements at the High School to address vehicular & pedestrian traffic issues

Improving Aging Buildings

- Restroom remodeling, improving ADA access
- Mechanical upgrades and water heater replacement
- Resurface track and construct new concessions, restroom and storage building at the stadium

Educational Programming / Learning Environments

- Addition of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) classrooms at the elementary schools for hands-on learning
- Addition of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) / Robotics classroom at the Middle / High School for hands-on learning
- Cafeteria, auxiliary gym and weight room addition at the High School
- Science lab improvements
- Selective furniture replacements

What is "STEM" and the importance of that program?

STEM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math. STEM programs blend together those subject matters into a curriculum. STEM programs help students develop key skills: problem-solving, creativity, critical analysis, teamwork, independent thinking, initiative, communication, and digital literacy. Students with STEM skills may have additional opportunities for employment and more capable to meet employers needs. Local employers have voiced their desire for workers with higher-level STEM skills for today's workforce.

What are the qualities of STEM classrooms?

A STEM workspace or lab space needs to support making, learning, exploring, and collaborating that uses high-tech to no-tech tools. These are hard-working spaces typically with concrete flooring, electrical power for tools and equipment, large surfaces for building & sharing materials.

Why is a new auxiliary gym included in the proposed projects?

There is a lack of gym space district-wide for various sports and extracurricular activities, including school gatherings, practices, and community events. Practices are having to be scheduled late in the evening. The new auxiliary gym would provide additional space for events, practices and games, and also provide more space for large gatherings.

When is the last time Watervliet had a bond proposal?

In 2014, Watervliet voters approved a bond proposal for \$23,035,000 for infrastructure improvements to aging buildings to things such as roofs, boilers, and lighting. The 2014 bond program was Phase 1 of the Master Plan for district facilities, which was developed in 2010. The 2023 bond proposal was developed as Phase 2 of the Master Plan, to continue addressing infrastructure needs, but also to update safety & security, and enhance educational programming.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

If approved, would the bond proposal have any impact on our current operational budget?

Bond proposal funds cannot be used for the general fund or operating purposes. However, if approved, the bond may have a positive impact on the annual operating budget in that operating funds otherwise intended or needed for capital expenditures could be spent on student programs and resources.

Would money from the bond proposal be used to pay teachers' salaries and benefits?

No. School districts are not allowed to use funds from a bond for operating expenses such as teacher, administrator or employee salaries, routine maintenance, or operating costs. Bond proceeds must be kept separate from operating funds and bond proceed expenditures must be audited by an independent auditing firm pursuant to State law.

How would the bond proposal impact my property taxes?

If approved by voters, it is estimated that the debt tax rate for 2024 would increase by 1.7 mills over the current debt tax rate. This equals approximately an additional \$7.08 per month for every \$100,000 of market value home. This is an estimate for informational purposes only.

If approved, when would the millage for this proposal first be levied?

On the July 1, 2024 property tax bill.

Are businesses and second homes (non-homestead)and primary homes (homestead)treated the same for the purpose of the bond millage?

Yes, businesses and second homes (non-homestead) and primary homes (homestead) are treated the same for the purpose of the bond millage debt levy.

PBIS frameworks can significantly reduce disruptive behaviors, bullying, and help facilitate the learning process. Most importantly, it can create a positive learning culture where students feel safe, secure and enjoy learning. PBIS focuses more on what students "can do" vs. what students "can't do". Instead of a list of "do's" and "don'ts", it focuses on behavioral expectations that keep students safe, it builds responsibility and it encourages respect.

Building



New Classroom Expands On-Campus Special Education Options

At the start of the 2023-24 school year, North Elementary will open its doors to a specialized classroom designed to meet the unique needs of students with a mild cognitive impairment. This program provides a necessary improvement to the overall special education options offered within Watervliet Public Schools.

Prior to the MiCI classroom at North Elementary being approved, students from Watervliet were referred to similar classrooms; one at Lakeshore Public Schools and one at Niles Community Schools. Capacity limits in these classrooms often left students from Watervliet and other districts placed on a waiting list. With support from Berrien RESA and federal grant funding, Watervliet students and students attending other districts within Berrien County may be referred to the MiCI program.

The new MiCI classroom at North Elementary does more than just add a much needed program to the special education continuum at Watervliet. It will decrease the number of students on other special education teacher caseloads allowing these teachers to provide more intensive instruction to fewer students at a time; resulting in increased achievement levels at a faster rate, coupled by a decrease in the amount of core content missed when a student is pulled out of a general education classroom.

A veteran teacher, Amy Jasso, will be the classroom teacher. Amy has a wide-range of experience, including providing instruction in a self-contained special education classroom. Most recently, Amy served as the resource room teacher at North. Her knowledge and expertise working with students that require a more intensive level of instruction, combined with her familiarity with the daily schedule at North School will help to get this classroom started in the right direction from the start.

With the 2023-24 school year right around the corner, the Special Education Team at Watervliet Public Schools is geared up to start providing students with learning opportunities that will help to make school the best part of their day!

Canvas (LMS) Learning Management System

LMS is the abbreviation for learning management system. It serves as a platform where teachers can post assignments, create discussion boards, and upload content like slide presentations and instructional videos. At teachers' discretion, students are also able to submit assignments through Canvas.

Family Education Rights and Privacy Act
