Academic Integrity

Academic integrity is a fundamental value of education and RMHS; therefore, acts of cheating, plagiarism, falsification or attempts to cheat, plagiarize or falsify will not be tolerated. Should it be determined that an academic integrity violation has taken place, the teacher reserves the right to assign a zero grade and then follow the appropriate discipline procedures. Repeated infractions will result in additional discipline.

Academic Information

RMHS Academic Expectations

Attending Red Mountain High School is a privilege and with that comes the responsibility for students to participate and progress academically. In class, students are expected to participate according to the directions of their teacher. Participation will lead to academic achievement and progress, the major goal of a high school education. The long-term reward is graduation, but the short term rewards are many and depend on the individual. Some overall scholastic expectations are as follows:

- Take notes.
- Study/review for tests.
- Participate in discussions.
- Enter class on time, prepared with necessary materials
- Ask for assistance from teachers/others as needed.
- Follow teacher directions.
- Complete homework.
- Engage your mind in the course.

Diploma Requirements

Students must earn 22 credits (16 required and 6 electives) and meet or exceed Arizona’s designated assessment requirements in order to graduate from a Mesa high school.

Transfer students must be enrolled in classes that place them on track for graduation and be enrolled through the semester of graduation. These students must have earned at least five (5) credits in an MPS high school to be eligible for an MPS diploma unless they transfer in the final semester of their high school experience. Students who transfer during the final semester of their senior year must earn three (3) credits to be eligible for a Mesa diploma. Students must check with the school student advisor or the registrar for specific details.

Students may participate only in commencement ceremonies held at the high school in which they were enrolled when graduation requirements were satisfied.

The Red Mountain Way

RED MOUNTAIN WAY SYSTEM OVERVIEW

Behavioral Framework

What is the Red Mountain Way Behavioral System?

The Red Mountain Way Behavioral System is a positive behavioral system designed to provide structured interventions and supports for each student on campus. This systematic approach is designed to teach and recognize positive behaviors that benefit academic and social environments on campus while at the same time providing instruction and support to correct problem behaviors.

What are positive behaviors?

Positive behaviors are those behaviors that demonstrate Courage, Respect, and Influence. The Red Mountain Behavior Matrix on the previous page outlines the ways Red Mountain students are expected to exhibit these pillar character traits.

How are positive behaviors rewarded?

If a staff member catches a student displaying one of the three characteristics of The Red Mountain Way, he or she has the opportunity to present the student with Red Mountain Change. These give students a chance to win prizes or be entered into larger drawings.

The Red Mountain Change (RMC) is given out at staff members' discretion using the Red Mountain Expectation Matrix as their guide. However, RMC is an extra thank you and should not be expected each time a student demonstrates one of the expectations from the Behavior Matrix.

How do you redeem the Red Mountain Change?

The Red Mountain Change may be redeemed for entry into the Quarterly Prize Drawing or a randomly designated prize from one of our three prize tiers. After you are given a RMC by a teacher or staff member, you should visit the Change Exchange in the library.

Hours

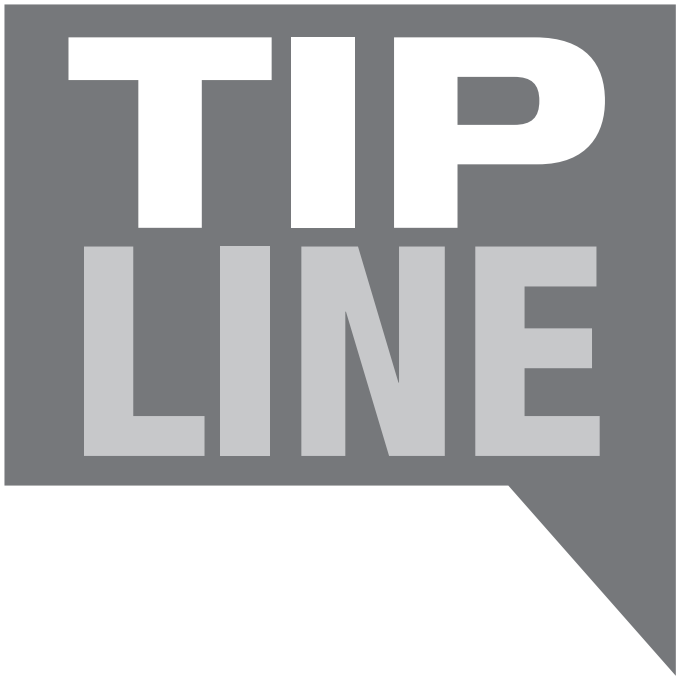
The Change Exchange will be opened before school, as well as, during lunchtime. Students should not be excused during class to redeem RMC.

Redemption Process

Be sure to bring your student ID with you to redeem your RMC. You will be given the option of entering your name in the drawing or taking the next incentive on the randomized list.

What about negative behaviors?

As we all know, from time to time everyone needs some help understanding what is expected of them. Our behavior flowchart outlines the campus wide process for behavior interventions. In addition to this intervention process, expectations will be taught and reinforced during designated times during the school day.

Athletics

Students, athletes, parents or fans may obtain athletic schedules from the Mesa Public Schools website at www.mesasports.org.

Student-Athlete Academic Requirements

Students must be enrolled in 5 classes and pass all classes at the end of each grading period. Seniors who are on track to graduate may enroll in four credit-earning classes and still be eligible. Grading periods and progress reports will determine eligibility. Grades of F, Audit (unless requested via audit form) and Incomplete are considered non-passing grades and will render a student ineligible if received. In order to regain your eligibility, progress reports must have all passing grades.

Physical Education Locks and Lockers

Students enrolled in physical education courses are issued lockers. Students can use specific locks available at the school bookstore to secure personal belongings in their assigned lockers. Lost or stolen locks are the responsibility of the student.

Family Sports Pass

A Family Sports Pass (FSP) admits parents and HS age or younger children to attend ALL home sporting events at RMHS, with the exception of regional and state tournaments. A child's name will be included on a FSP if (s)he is enrolled in Kindergarten through 12th grade. Purchase of FSP also entitles all Red Mountain students to an Activity Pass. You have the option of purchasing the FSP via the summer pre-registration process or in the bookstore. Cost is \$125.00, August 1st - Dec. 1st for all three sports seasons. The cost is \$75.00 for winter and spring seasons only. Proceeds from sales of FSP's are used to cover costs associated with running the RMHS athletic program.

Any child 8 years and under may attend a Red Mountain home athletic event for free.

Athlete Attendance/Discipline

Student athletes are expected to be present at least half of the school day (4 class periods) to be eligible to participate in a sport for that day. Any student athletes who are suspended with an Out of School Suspension (OSS) may not participate in any school activity including practice, until the day after the suspension has ended. Any student who is assigned OSS on a Friday that precedes a Saturday event cannot participate in that event. Repeated or serious discipline infractions may result in suspension or removal from the team.

Sportsmanship/Fan Behavior

RMHS is committed to the highest ideals of sportsmanship as well as to establishing a healthy environment for competition. Negative statements or actions towards competitors, coaches, officials, or fans in attendance at our events will not be tolerated. This includes: taunting, trash-talking, baiting, or berating players, officials or coaches, or actions which cause ridicule or embarrassment to others. Warnings will not be issued and offenders will be ejected without refund. Violators can be suspended from attending all RMHS extracurricular events and activities. All school disciplinary codes are also in effect in our continuing effort to establish a school community of respect, courtesy and citizenship.

Bookstore

All fines and fees must be paid through the Bookstore or online. Lost & Found is located in the Bookstore. School supplies are available at the bookstore. Textbooks and related printed subject matter materials are provided to the student at no cost. **Lost and damaged textbooks must be replaced by the student at full cost. All payments for extracurricular activities are to be paid in the bookstore as well as any ECA (tax deductible) donations. The bookstore is open from 7:45 a.m.- 3:45 p.m.**

Buses

In order for a student to ride a bus they must be carrying their student ID card. Those students riding buses are expected to follow district and school rules and regulations. The safety of you, your friends and other students depends on your proper conduct. **Bus riding is a privilege - not a right! Disciplinary issues will be referred to the grade level administrator and violators may be subject to suspension and or revocation of riding privileges.**

Cafeteria

Students have access to the cafeteria where a variety of meals are prepared. Free and reduced-price meal applications are available. To apply, pick up an application from the cafeteria and return it for the free or reduced meal. A snack bar and food cart also offers a la carte items for lunch. It is the responsibility of each student to "bus" their own table and take pride in keeping the cafeteria and grounds clean. Students who receive free or reduced-price meals and students with lunch accounts must present their school identification to use these services.

Cell Phones & Electronic Devices

In order to provide for the best possible learning environment, electronic devices are not allowed to be on or visible during class time, without teacher permission. Teachers have the right to confiscate all electronic devices. Repeat infractions involving cell phones, or any other electronic devices, will result in progressive disciplinary consequences. Students who bring these devices to school, do so at their own risk. Red Mountain High School is not responsible for these devices and the school will not go to extraordinary measures to recover lost/stolen electronic devices.

Chronic Health Problems

Chronic Health forms are available in the nurse's office. **A student with chronic health problems must reapply and complete the program certification process each semester.**

Students certified as having a chronic health condition will not be penalized for absences as long as the absences are excused and are due solely to the documented chronic health condition.

Homework will be made available to students with chronic health problems on request. Students are accountable for all missed work due to absence.

Please note: If a condition will remove a student more than three continuous weeks from school, alternate education may need to be addressed such as Mesa Distance Learning or the Homebound program.

Closed Campus/Senior Release

Red Mountain High School is a closed campus. Closed campus begins when a student arrives on campus (see Good Neighbor Policy). Students with an early release on their schedule must obtain a release sticker from the bookstore in order to leave campus. All students must obtain the permission of their administrator to purchase a duplicate ID for \$5.00.

The MPS Governing Board has determined that seniors "IN GOOD STANDING," who have permission of their parent/guardian, may leave campus for lunch. Seniors are issued an ID that identifies their status.

Commons

Students are invited to become acquainted with the Media Center to use its services regularly. The Media Center staff is always available to help students and staff with research and recreational reading. Maintaining a learning environment and taking proper care of materials is the responsibility of each student and staff member.

A pass is not required before or after school, but all students need a pass during regular school hours while classes are in session. School rules for behavior apply in the Media Center at all times. Students MUST have an ID and an educational purpose in order to use the Internet. A student ID is required in order to check out any materials. Food and drink items are not permitted in the Commons.

Clubs

RMHS faculty and administration believe success in school is related to extracurricular involvement. RMHS is a comprehensive high school offering not only academic success but also opportunities for involvement in athletics, activities and service to our community. Many of our clubs and athletic teams are extremely successful. You will have the opportunity to explore clubs on CLUB DAY. If you have an area of interest that is not currently represented on campus with a club we encourage you to inquire about chartering a new club on campus.

Please note that clubs must re-charter each year. There may be tryouts or requirements for participation in some of these clubs/activities. Please note that your membership/participation in clubs activities with requirements for participation may be suspended and or revoked at the joint discretion of a school administrator and the club sponsor if it is deemed that you have not adhered to the requirements. Any fundraising must be submitted by the club sponsor via an Activity Fundraising Request Form for approval from the Assistant Principal for Activities. Posters, advertisements and flyers must be approved by an administrator PRIOR to being posted on campus. All postings are limited to 30 copies per event. For any fundraising that includes the collection of cash the club sponsor and club officer(s) must utilize an Activity Fund Raising Fund Report.

Counseling Center

The emphasis of the Counseling Center is developmental and preventative counseling, as well as working with students involving course selections and registration. The Red Mountain Counseling Center offers assistance in the following areas:

- academic planning
- career exploration
- transcript evaluation
- crisis counseling
- classroom presentations
- postgraduate planning
- personal and social counseling
- parent conferences
- testing
- financial aid and scholarships

Students are assigned a counselor by grade level. To speak with a counselor, appointments may be scheduled throughout the day, before and after school, and at lunch. Appointments are scheduled with the counseling secretary and a pass will be provided to report to the Counseling Office.

The Counseling Center is open from 7:30am to 3:30pm.

The College and Career Center is an extension of the Counseling Office and has information that will help students with regard to vocational and college decisions. Vocational information, college catalogs scholarship information, college visitations, and post grad opportunities are available to all students. Visit the Commons for additional info.

Dance Information

In order to promote a safe and orderly school environment at all RMHS Dances, students and guests will be asked to comply with the following guidelines.

- If guests are enrolled in HS (grades 9-12), a copy of his/her current school ID must be attached to a guest form.
- If the guest has already graduated, he/she may not be over the age of 20 and must attach a copy of his/her driver's license or non-driver state ID to a guest form.
- RMHS students must enter and leave with the guest. Once you have entered the dance/event, you may not leave and return.
- Guests must show his/her current school ID (if under age 20) or a driver's license/non-driver state ID (if already graduated) for admission to the dance/event. The ID shown must match the photocopy of the ID from the original application in order to be considered valid.
- The guest application must be submitted to RMHS administration prior to the dance/event. Applications will not be accepted at the door.
- RMHS students are responsible for the behavior and demeanor of their guests. RMHS students are responsible for informing the guest of all RMHS behavior and dress code rules. In the event that a guest does not follow the rules, he/she will not be allowed to attend another RMHS dance/event.
- Freshmen are not permitted to attend Prom and Sophomores must be invited by a Junior or Senior to Prom.
- The following are specifically prohibited at RMHS school sponsored dances: sexually explicit dancing, dancing that can result in injury or which may be a personal safety hazard, consumption or being under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- Any person removed from the dance/event by RMHS staff is not entitled to a refund.

Homecoming & Prom Royalty Requirements

In order to be eligible to represent RMHS for Homecoming Court or Prom Royalty, students cannot have served an "Out of School Suspension" (OSS) within the last 2 years, have no attendance audits, and must be in good academic standing with passing grades in all courses.

Deliveries & Messages to Students

RMHS CANNOT interrupt instructional class time for any items dropped off for students. Students may pick up these items in the Attendance Office before school, during lunch, after-school and during passing periods. RMHS will not be responsible for items not delivered nor will we contact students that the item is in the Attendance Office.

In addition deliveries such as cash/checks, food items from outside vendors, balloons, flowers, stuffed animals, will not be accepted. All money brought for lunch must be paid in the cafeteria.

RMHS WILL NOT interrupt instructional class time in order to deliver a message to a student unless a school administrator has deemed it an emergency.

School Store deliveries will take place during Homeroom.

Directory Information

Directory information may be released to the public unless the parent or eligible student gives written notice to the district that any or all such information should not be made public without prior consent. Any such notice must be given to the guidance director at the district's Student Services Center within two weeks after receiving the handbook or after the student enrolls.

Directory information includes the following: name, address and telephone number; names of the parents; address and telephone number of the parents; date and place of birth of the student; class designation (grade, etc.); extracurricular participation; weight and height if a member of an athletic team; attendance dates; awards received; and photograph.

Be aware that directory information is used to compile such things as student telephone directories, athletic programs and yearbooks.

Dress Standards

Please refer to Governing Board policy JFCA and administrative regulation JFCA-R for information on dress and grooming.

Drug Free Schools Statement

RMHS is considered a "drug free school zone" under state law. Therefore the following is prohibited:

- The use, distribution or possession of a tobacco product on school property regardless of the individuals age.
- The use, distribution, manufacture, purchase or sale of illegal drugs, inhalants, noxious substances, drug paraphernalia, imitations of illegal drugs/noxious substances, dietary supplements, or medication.
- The use, possession, sale, purchase or distribution of alcoholic substances.
- Intoxication of being under the influence at a school event.

Medications

Medications must be administered and stored in the health office. The medication must be in its original container and prescription medication must have an unaltered pharmaceutical label attached.

Facility Usage

The facilities at RMHS are available for use by clubs, activities and outside organizations. Requests must be submitted via a Facility Usage & Request Form by a staff member or adult. After the proper paperwork is submitted and approved, the activity or event will be added to the calendar. Unauthorized use of the facility is prohibited.

Fees/Fee Payment

Students are responsible for payment of all class related fees prior to being permitted to participate and receive a grade for the class. Any student who does not pay the required class fees will receive an incomplete and may lose credit.

Good Neighbor Policy

State law allows schools to become involved in appropriate incidents where students are en route to school or en route home. School administrators can discipline students involved in such incidents.

The sidewalks and lawns of our neighbors whose homes are near campus are off limits to Red Mountain students. You are welcome to use the sidewalks to and from school but not to loiter on the sidewalks, lawns or at shopping centers during the school day. Red Mountain Park is off limits before- & after school.

Red Mountain students are not allowed to be on any other Mesa Public School campus during the school day. If a student wishes to visit another Mesa school, the student must receive permission from that school's administration.

Graduation Honor for Excellence in Service Learning

All Mesa High school students have the opportunity to earn the Mesa Public Schools Honor for Excellence in Service Learning. Students who earn this Honor will receive:

- A special seal on their graduation diploma
- A notation of the Honor on their transcript

The Honor in Service Learning will be awarded to students for their completion of 150 hours of unpaid service throughout their four years of high school. Those hours include preparation, action, and reflection. Freshman may apply for Option B upon graduation from 8th grade. Students may earn hours from a combination of curriculum-based and extracurricular service. Please contact the service learning coach at your school or visit our website: www.mesaservicelearning.org, to find out more.

Immunizations

Arizona law requires documentary proof of immunity against certain childhood diseases for students entering Arizona schools for the first time. With some exceptions, students subject to this requirement who lack documentary proof may enroll but not attend school until proof is provided. If your child is entering an Arizona school for the first time, please obtain an "MPS Fact Sheet: Documentation of Immunization" from your school or the district's Student Services Department.

Lost & Found

The lost and found is located in the Bookstore. Items that are found should be turned in to the Bookstore Manager. If items are stolen, see Security immediately to fill out an incident report. While a reasonable effort will be made to assist you in cases of theft, vandalism or accident, please note that RMHS DOES NOT assume responsibility for students' personal property and items while on campus (i.e. automobiles, bikes, cycles, clothing, backpacks, purses, locker contents, wallets, electronic devices, etc.)

Personal Items

RMHS cannot assume responsibility for students' personal property and items while on campus (e.g.: automobiles, bikes, cycles, clothing, backpacks, purses, locker contents, electronic devices, etc.) and will not go to extraordinary lengths to recover lost items.

Off-Campus Jurisdiction

In accordance with state law, violations in conduct by students going to and from school could result in disciplinary action.

School rules and other reasonable expectations of acceptable student behavior are extended to include student conduct while off campus during the regular school day or at any school sponsored event. This includes the student's conduct while going to and from school, during the lunch hour and released periods and any off campus school related activity. A student may be disciplined by the school for any misconduct while off-campus at the times specified above.

Students who want to park on campus must obtain a "Parking Pass" prior to utilizing the parking area.

Parking On Campus

The following must be attached in order to process parking permit:

- Copy of vehicle registration
- Copy of student's driver's license
- Copy of insurance

Parking on school grounds is a privilege, not a right, limited to students who possess a valid driver's license, registration, and vehicle insurance. The \$40.00 fee includes registration of up to three vehicles. Students must adhere to parking/driving guidelines listed on the parking application. A violation may result in suspension of parking privileges and/or suspension from school.

Students who park without a visible parking pass may have their vehicle booted and be subject to suspension and may ultimately include towing of the vehicle.

Restricted Areas to Students

Students are to remain in supervised areas during school hours. During lunch hours, students are to remain in designated areas. Red Mountain Park is not part of the school campus and students are not permitted before, during, or after school.

Schedule Changes/ Dropping Classes

Schedule changes will be permitted for the following reasons:

1. Missing a lunch period
2. Missing a class period
3. Missing a prerequisite class
4. Missing a class needed for graduation
5. A class that you completed in summer school or online is on your schedule

Level changes will be permitted at the 4 ½ week grading period, if the teacher, parent, and student are in agreement that the class is not the appropriate placement. Please see your counselor regarding specific guidelines.

Release Time will only be granted to Senior students on track for graduation and enrolled in all appropriate courses on campus.

Schoolwide Expectations

1. Maintain a positive, productive learning environment.
2. Treat fellow students, staff members and your school with respect.
3. Report unsafe conditions.
4. No loitering/sitting in hallways; NO PDA (public displays of affection) on campus.
5. No food/drink in hallways.
6. Electronic devices that interrupt the learning environment may be confiscated.
7. Follow attendance guidelines; ditching and 10 absences may result in loss of credit.

Student Attendance Guidelines

These guidelines are not complete. A complete list of MPS Guidelines was given to students the first week of school and sent home to give to parents. Parent and student signed off on receipt of guidelines.

- A student must attend 90% of all class sessions in order to be eligible to receive credit. Therefore, students may not miss a class more than 9 times in a semester. School events/activities or days missed due to disciplinary action do not count towards the 9 absences maximum; however, students are still responsible for all make-up work.
- Absences must be excused within 24 hours of the date of the absence. If an absence is not excused within that time frame the absence will then be documented as "unexcused".
- A student may lose credit on the 10th absence from a class. It will be at the discretion of the grade level administrator as to the level of educational benefit the student is receiving from his/her enrollment and whether or not the student will be dropped from the class. In some cases, the student can be withdrawn from the class.
- Students who reach 10 absences in a class may be placed on audit status (loss of credit). Students on audit status may receive a "NC" as a grade unless the student is failing, then s/he will receive an "F".
- Appeals will only be granted for extenuating circumstances such as documented chronic illness or long term illness, court requirements, or bereavement. Vacations and non-school related trips cannot be appealed.
- Any missed work that results from an "unexcused" or "unverified" absence will not be accepted for a grade or credit. Sweep does not postpone deadlines or due dates. Any missed work due to a sweep will receive a zero grade.
- A student with an excused absence will have 2 days for each day absent to make up the work.
- Tardiness - See Tardy Policy

Student ID/Athletics Card

Every student is required to wear a Red Mountain High School ID card when on campus or when involved in a school activity. Failure to produce student ID when asked by staff may result in a referral. Student IDs must be used in order to leave campus at lunch (seniors), for release periods, obtain textbooks, pick up yearbooks, use computers/internet at school, for discounts at athletic events, and for discounts at area businesses. Replacement cards are \$5.00.

Students may wish to purchase a Red Mountain High School Athletics Card for \$25.00. The purchase and presentation of this card allows students free admission to AIA home regular season sporting events.

Student Records

Access to educational records is governed by federal law (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act). Parents and students 18 years of age or older have the following rights in connection with educational records:

1. To inspect and review the student's educational records.
2. To request amendment of the student's educational records to ensure that the records are not inaccurate, misleading or in violation of student rights, including the right to a hearing, if necessary.
3. To consent to disclosure of personally identifiable information contained in the student's educational record, except that information deemed "directory information" may be disclosed without consent unless the parent/eligible student directs in writing that this information not be made public without prior consent. Disclosure may also be made without consent in certain circumstances allowed by FERPA.
4. To file complaints with the U.S. Department of Education.
5. To obtain a copy of Governing Board policy JO: Student Records, by requesting a copy from the principal. Copies of board policy JO are located at each school and at the district office.

Divorced parents have equal rights relating to students' records unless the school has been provided a court order to the contrary.

Lunch

Freshmen, Sophomores and Juniors are prohibited from leaving campus during lunch. Seniors, with appropriate ID, are permitted to leave for lunch.

OFF LIMIT AREAS for all students include any areas outside of the black fence, any area south of Red Mountain Way, or any area that cannot be supervised. Students are also not allowed into Red Mountain Park or to loiter at or around the seminary building.

Technology

Student e-mail access:

All MPS students are automatically given an e-mail address and access to an MPS-specific log-in and electronic service provided through the internet by MPS.

Students are able to access their e-mail accounts and Google apps from ANY computer with an internet connection. HOWEVER, both the e-mail and the apps function best with the CHROME search engine (which is a free download).

- Access to Student MPSConnect: mail.google.com (or go to the main MPS webpage, mpsaz.org, and click on MPS Connect under Students on the left side of the page)
- Student user names/addresses will be first initial, middle initial, last name (up to 14 characters), birth month (two-digit) and birth day (two-digit)
 - Martin S. McFly born November 5, 1995 = msmcfly1105
- Password default is first name initial (capitalized), last name initial (lowercase), and six-digit ID number
 - Example: Mm123456
 - Students can change their passwords from the default for their security.
 - If students lock themselves out of the e-mail by unsuccessfully attempting to log-in more than 3 times, they may have their passwords re-set to the default to re-gain access. The Media Center specialists can do this for them.
- Usage of Student MPSConnect is a privilege and is subject to any rules set forth by the school and guidelines and policies of Mesa Public Schools (go to www.mpsaz.org/mpsconnect/parents for more information)

Student Portal access:

Your personal account on the MyMPS Student Portal gives you online access to your current grades and scheduling information from any computer with an internet connection. You will need to remember your user name and password to gain access to the system.

To get your activation key, visit the school's front office to request an activation key. Should you forget your password, you will need to re-activate your account by again visiting the office and requesting a new activation key.

- Select the "I am a student >>" link on the right side of the page.
- Select "I have an activation key and need to create my account >>"
- Read and Accept the Privacy Statement
- Enter your name and activation key as it appears at the top of this letter. Once completed, click the Continue to Step 3 button.
- Make note of your user name as it has already been created for you and cannot be changed. Create and confirm your password and select the Complete Account Activation button.

Always keep your password secure. Memorize it and do not share it with others.

Tardy Policy

The expectation of Red Mountain High students is that they be in class on time, respecting their own learning, as well as that of their peers. If a student enters class late, they miss critical instruction. For that reason, the following tardy policy will be implemented:

1. Students who enter the room after the final bell are considered tardy.
2. Students who arrive at school accompanied by a parent can report to the attendance office for a pass to class, however, it does count as a tardy. Notes or phone calls are not accepted to excuse a student's tardiness.
3. If a student is more than ten minutes late, they will be considered absent, which may be excused by parent/guardian.
4. After five tardies, a student may be referred to administration.

Visitors at School

Parents are always welcome at RMHS. MPS Governing Board policy directs that for safety and security reasons all visitors register at the office in order to obtain permission to remain on school grounds or to enter any classroom. Classroom visitation during school hours must be prearranged with school administration. Student visitors or adult visitors are not allowed on RMHS campus during the regular school day.

Violators of this policy will be cited for trespassing.

Red Mountain 1:1 Initiative

Introduction

Red Mountain is excited to be included in the Mesa Public Schools implementation of a one device per student (1:1) program, which provides each student with a device for educational use at school and at home.

This initiative provides exciting learning opportunities for students. Under the careful guidance of their teachers, students use their devices to support their education in a variety of ways.

For complete information needed to successfully participate in the program, please see the Red Mountain High School Student Device Handbook, available on our website.

Policy Overview

Mesa Public Schools is committed to using technology to provide an exceptional learning experience for all students. Highlights from Governing Board Policy JFCH – Student Technology Use include:

- Mesa Public Schools provides technology access to support the educational mission of its schools and to enhance the curriculum and learning opportunities for students and staff.
- The use of district technology by students is a privilege and subject to all applicable district policies and regulations, and state and federal laws.
- Students who violate district policy regarding device/internet use may have their privileges revoked and be subject to further disciplinary and/or legal action.
- All district technology remains under the control, custody (ownership) and supervision of the school.

Parent/Guardian Responsibilities

A strong partnership between school and home will help students be successful in the 1:1 program. Parent responsibilities are to:

- Review the information in this handbook.
- Read Responsible Use of Technology on page 16.
- Determine whether to select the Device Protection Plan offered by the district or assume the financial responsibility for damage, loss or theft. Plan details are on page 14.
- Sign the Technology Device User Agreement and return it to school with your student so he or she can receive the device during registration.
- Monitor student use away from school.
- Ensure the device is properly cared for outside of school.

Receiving and Returning Your Device

To receive the device, a student must submit a signed Technology Device User Agreement to acknowledge receipt of the device and understanding of responsibilities related to the device.

The device must be returned to the school

- at the end of the school year,
- upon withdrawal or transfer to another district school or
- at the request of the school.

It must be returned in working order with all parts and accessories included or the appropriate fees will be assessed. The fee schedule is on page 15 of this handbook.

Caring For Your Device

Proper use and care of your Lenovo ThinkPad Yoga 11e is essential. This includes caring for the included power cord and stylus. Please follow these guidelines.

At all times

- Follow the Responsible Use of Technology guidelines on page 16 of this handbook.
- Protect your device from damage due to food, liquids or extreme heat or cold.
- Do not place items on top of your device.

At school

- Do not leave your device unattended.
- Secure your device properly in your bag or backpack when not in use.
- Have your power cord with you.

At home

- Charge your device every night. Students are expected to come to school with a fully charged device.
- Store your stylus and power cord with your device.
- Do not leave your device unattended where it could be accidentally damaged by food, liquids, pets or small children.

Traveling to and from school

- Do not leave your device in a vehicle or on the school bus.
- In public, keep your device out of view.
- Secure your device properly in your bag or backpack while traveling.

Device care

- Use a soft, dry microfiber or lint-free cloth to clean your device screen.
- Report any issues with your device promptly to a parent, teacher or school official.
- Do not remove the district barcode or school identification sticker from your device.
- Do not install, uninstall or modify any application, game or operating system component without school authorization.
- Do not deface the device exterior, including unauthorized stickers.

Device Protection Plan (DPP)

As part of the district's 1:1 technology initiative, parents have the option to enroll in the district's Device Protection Plan (DPP). Enrollment in the plan will minimize the potential repair and/or replacement costs associated with the device.

By selecting this plan on the Technology Device User Agreement, you agree to pay an annual fee of \$30 to be enrolled in the DPP. If a device becomes damaged, your student will take it to the school's repair center and pay a \$20 fee for repair. If the device is lost or stolen, a fee of \$200 will be assessed. These fees apply to each occurrence.

Enrollment in the DPP does not begin until the annual \$30 payment has been received.

What's covered under this plan

- Accidental damage, such as cracked screens or cases, broken keyboards, etc.
- Battery replacement (if it is determined that the battery is malfunctioning)
- Loss of power cord or stylus
- Replacement of lost or stolen device. If the device is stolen, a police report must be filed with a copy of the report sent to the district.

Intentional damage to the device is not covered under this plan.

Repair/Replacement Costs

Parents and students who choose not to purchase the Device Protection Plan are responsible for 100 percent of all repair and replacement costs for the device.

Should your student's device become accidentally damaged, they will be provided a loaner device while their assigned device is being repaired. The loaner must be returned upon completion of the repairs. This loaner device may not be of equivalent performance or features.

***** All repairs must be made by MPS certified technicians *****

Using The Device Securely

Students are required to enter their district-assigned user ID and password to operate the device. The device has security features and filtering intended to protect and prohibit your student from accessing inappropriate materials on the internet, unless specific action has been taken to bypass these features. Security features and filtering are in effect at school, and on home or other networks, including public libraries, restaurants and airports.

Responsible Use Of Technology

Students must use their device in compliance with Governing Board Policy JFCH, which outlines appropriate technology use. Students and parents must acknowledge they have read this policy, including its regulation, and understand that violation of this policy will result in a loss of privileges and further disciplinary action.

Prohibited uses

Your student is responsible for his or her own actions involving district technology, along with personal files, passwords and accounts. Uses and activities that are expressly prohibited include:

- Accessing, submitting, transmitting, posting, publishing, forwarding, downloading, scanning or displaying materials that are defamatory, abusive, obscene, vulgar, sexually explicit, sexually suggestive, threatening, discriminatory, harassing and/or illegal.
- Soliciting or distributing information with the intent to threaten, harass or bully others.
- Using district technology for any illegal activity or activity that violates other Board policies, procedures and/or school rules.
- Copying or downloading copyrighted materials, including software, without the permission of the copyright owner or express authorization of the student's teacher or principal.
- Representing as one's own work any materials obtained on the internet, such as term papers and articles. When internet sources are used in student work, the author, publisher and website must be identified.
- Using an unreasonably high level of internet bandwidth provided by district technology.
- Using district technology for non-school-related purposes.
- Sharing passwords, using other users' passwords without permission and/or accessing other users' accounts.
- Any malicious use, disruption or harm to the school's technology devices, networks and internet services, including, but not limited to, hacking activities and creating or uploading malware.
- Accessing social networks without specific authorization from the supervising teacher.
- Misuse of a school name or logo on a personal website that gives the reader the impression that the website is an official school or district website.

The district retains control, custody and supervision of all district technology. The district reserves the right to monitor student usage of all district technology. Students have no right of privacy in their use of district technology, including email and stored files.

Device Support

Mesa Public Schools is committed to providing the necessary support to students' use of the device. Students have several options when it comes to getting the help they need.

Troubleshooting Guides - Students have access to simple troubleshooting steps via Red Mountain's website. These guides are accessible 24/7.

Information Systems Help Desk - Students may call the Mesa Public Schools Help Desk at 480-472-0044. Someone is available for assistance between 6:30 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Red Mountain Certified Technicians - These technicians will be available before, during and after school hours. They are located in the Commons, 480-472-0033.

Red Mountain Educational Technology Trainers - These integration specialists focus on educator professional development. They will be available before, during and after school hours. They are located in the Commons.

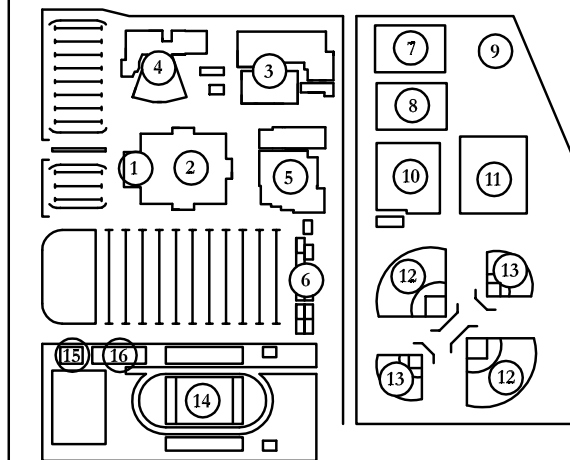
