#### **COVID - Protocol**

As per our past practice with any illness, students with self-reported illnesses (including COVID) are not Medically Excused [MD] absences from school unless the illness has been confirmed by a healthcare provider (this can include the school nurse and/or the health department's contagious disease rep). Illnesses are marked as unexcused Parent Call [PC] absences if they are not confirmed by a healthcare provider.

Upon the official conclusion of the COVID pandemic scheduled for May 11th, COVID care at school will not change between May 11-June 8, 2023 as the illness care, transmission vectors, and prevention is not altered by the fact that COVID is no longer at pandemic levels. In the same way that our schools manage other contagious diseases such as Pertussis or Chickenpox or Strep according to their disease processes, we will continue to manage COVID illness according to its disease process.

Student Information for the 2023-2024 School Year

Over the next few weeks, we will begin the process of assigning students to an appropriate class for next year. In putting together our roster of classes, we will take into consideration many factors including: girl/boy ratio, academic ability, behavioral characteristics, talents, personalities, needs, and learning styles. Our goal is to ensure that each child is in a class that has an appropriate balance of students with the proper teacher. We will assess each child using the data collected from the present classroom teacher(s), specialists, and the input of the counselor, interventionists, and principal. Class placement will be made after reviewing this considerable data

If you feel that we would benefit from additional information, please send the attached form in an envelope addressed to Mrs. Bjerke to Lincoln Primary School or email the form to hbjerke@anacondaschools.org or Mr. Kelly at jkelly@anacondaschools.org. You **SHOULD NOT** name a specific teacher. This form is designed to speak to your child's areas of strength and need, and not to a specific teacher preference. **Requests for specific teachers will not be considered.** 

Much time and attention goes into creating well-balanced class groupings that consider the social, academic, and emotional needs of our students, as well as any input which is shared by parents on the Class Placement Input Form. We ask all parents to respect the amount of hard work and thought that the principal, school counselors, interventionists, classroom teachers, and special education teachers put into this process. Please do not request changes to your child's placement

Moving even one child from a class could upset the balance of a classroom and have an impact that extends far beyond your child. Your son may not have gotten his "first" choice of teacher. Your daughter may not be with all of her friends from last year. You may be disappointed because you've heard through the grapevine that Mr. "A" isn't as "warm and fuzzy" as Mrs. "B". All of our teachers are caring, capable, and highly qualified educators, and our job as adults is to support students and to help them develop confidence and a positive outlook as they begin the new school year, encouraging them to look forward to the challenges and excitement that accompany making new friends and getting to know a new teacher. **Thank you for your cooperation in not requesting changes and for your understanding, trust, and support.** Families will learn of official classroom placements when 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter report cards are sent home in June.

For your convenience, a form is provided to allow your input in the placement process. You are not required to fill out this form. Student Information forms must be returned by <u>Friday</u>, <u>May 5<sup>th</sup></u>. Forms received after this date will not be considered.





#### What is Circle of Security Parenting (COSP)?

- It is an Evidence-Based parenting class that helps parents form a healthy attachment to their children.
- COSP helps parents build on their strengths and work through their weaknesses.
- In COSP we accept that there is no such thing as a perfect parent and that no matter what you are always good enough.

#### How can COSP help?

- COSP helps you identify how to read your child's behavior, though there is no instruction manual to parenting, our children become that instruction manual.
- COSP can help you identify what is "hidden in plain sight that you may not see in the rush of everyday life and parenting."

- Parents of children ages 0-5
- Expectant parents


