Greetings Everyone!

The frigid temperatures this week kept all of us on our toes, but we made it through the school week safely. Thank you to our Director of Operations and Maintenance, Scott Stachacz, and our custodians and maintenance staff for keeping the boilers up to temperature and the sidewalks cleared for our students and staff. Overall, our COVID-19 cases and quarantines continue to decrease and we are thankful for everyone's efforts to remain safe and healthy. As we progress through the school year, we must continue to focus on reversing the negative impacts of remote learning over the previous two years. We will continue to implement strategies that maintain safe and healthy school environments, while prioritizing in-person learning opportunities for children.

COVID-19 Metrics

As of today, we have 20 active COVID-19 cases between students and staff members in our 5 schools and district office. In addition, we have 0 outbreaks at this time. NEW Vaccines: Flu & Meningococcal

The health department recommends an annual influenza (flu) vaccination for everyone 6 months and older with any licensed influenza vaccine that is appropriate for the recipient's age and health status.

Flu vaccination is the best way to protect yourself and your loved ones against flu and its potentially serious complications. Meningococcal vaccines help protect against the bacteria that causes meningococcal disease. It is a required vaccine for students at age 11 and a booster dose at 16 years old. Quarantine Guidelines

The Illinois State Board of Education and the Illinois Department of Public Health have adopted the updated quarantine guidelines from the Centers for Disease Control and that information can be found <u>at this link</u>. In summary, the quarantine period has decreased to 5 days for unvaccinated individuals who are considered a close contact. **Students and adults who are up to date with COVID-19 vaccinations will not have to quarantine if they are only a close contact.**

Free COVID-19 At-Home Tests

Every home in the United States is eligible to order four free at-home COVID-19 tests. Please click <u>here</u> to order. A home test is not acceptable proof of absence of COVID-19 in symptomatic individuals, but it will provide you with important information about your infection status.
