### **OUR SCHOOL & COMMUNITY**

Bellows Free Academy (BFA) is a four-year comprehensive high school which hosts the Northwest Career & Technical Center as well as the surrounding tuition students of Franklin and Grand Isle Counties. St. Albans is in Franklin County, an agricultural area in the Champlain Valley. Franklin County is the largest dairy and maple syrup producing county in Vermont. More than half of BFA students are first generation.

#### CURRICULUM

BFA offers accelerated courses in English, Social Studies, and Mathematics; and Advanced Placement courses in English Literature, English Composition, U.S. History, U.S. Government, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Environmental Science, Calculus, Statistics, and Studio Art. Courses ending with a 6&7 are college prep and an 8 are accelerated or AP.

### **COVID SCHEDULE CHANGES**

Traditionally, BFA has been on a yearlong class schedule. In the fall 2020, many schools throughout Vermont began the year in a hybrid schedule. Bellows Free Academy created a 4x4 schedule, where students met for enrichment/proficiency recovery and had three new classes which met everyday for 80 minutes. Semester classes became quarter long and year long became semester. Students now meet with their teachers and 50% less students two days a week face-to-face and three days virtually.

### **CHANGES DUE TO COVID**

On March 15th, 2020, Vermont's Governor in partnership with the Agency of Education & Department of Health directed schools to provide remote learning, which continued through June 2020. Many schools adjusted their grading and reporting system. At Bellows Free Academy students who were not meeting proficiency by the close of the year were given incompletes. They have the remainder of this school year to prove proficiency with a content teacher.

### **FOLLOW-UP:**

Class of 2020: 53% attending 4-year colleges,; 10% attending 2-year colleges or other post-secondary schools. SAT Scores for Class of 2019: Mean Score – 1050; English Reading and Writing - 534; Mean Math – 516. ACT composite 23.8.
