## Illinois Assessment of Readiness

Annawan Grade School, grades $3^{\text {rd }}-8^{\text {th }}$ will have one series of IAR online computer based tests this school year. The standardized tests of math, reading, and writing will be given in the window of April $4^{\text {th }}-8^{\text {th }}$. We are trying to do two assessments in a day rather than spreading the testing out over two weeks.

Please have your son/daughter present at school and avoid outside appointments if possible. Be sure they get enough sleep and I hope to have a breakfast type snack each day of testing for those students who are participating. These tests are mandated by the Illinois Department of Education.

The fifth, eighth, and a designated high school class will be taking an on-line science test in April. This is also a mandate from the Illinois State Board of Education. We have these scheduled for April 19, 20, and 21. These will also be three tests at 40 minutes each.

## IESA Scholar Attitude Award

I am happy to announce the IESA Scholar Attitude Award recipient this school year is Ethan DeMay. To qualify, an eighth grade student must meet a variety of standards which includes being a member of an IESA school activity both their $7^{\text {th }}$ and $8^{\text {th }}$ grade year, a GPA of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale, and demonstrate outstanding citizenship. ## Loading and Unloading of Students

Thank you for your cooperation with loading students at the end of the day in front of the school and unloading as they arrive in the back of the school. Please do not allow your son or daughter to move through cars or onto the road to load because of the risk of an accident, especially with slick roads. Please pull forward along the curbing when there is an opening. This way we can load eight to ten cars and loading will go much quicker. Following the staff directions will assist in this process. We wish to keep this area as safe as we possibly can for each student. Thank you for your help and cooperation in this matter.

Please avoid the front entrance of the grade school between 8:00 and 8:15 a.m. so the buses can unload students. Any parked vehicle in this location will block the driveway for the busses to pass through.

Grade school students should not be walking through the high school before and after school unless there is a necessary reason to be there. This will help avoid possible problems.

Students exiting the back door (blue hallway) are walkers. This exit is not intended for cars/vehicles to pick up students for safety reasons. Always pick up your children at the front of the school.

## Dress for Weather

With the cold temperatures and snow, please dress your son or daughter appropriately for the weather conditions of the day. Recess will be outside unless I feel it is too cold and students need to be prepared if we go outside on acceptable days.

## COVID PROTOCOL 1/24/2022 (updated)

These are the guidelines given to us from the Illinois Department of Public Health(IDPH) to ensure all students are safe and healthy in our school environment. Thank you for partnering with us to make sure we can keep our school running smoothly.

## If a student has symptoms,

- Please keep the student and ALL household members home from school unless they are fully vaccinated.(*Individuals over 18, please see footnote.)


## Symptoms:

| Fever 100.4 or higher | Nausea |

If a student develops symptoms, the options for returning are:

- Doctor's note saying symptoms are not Covid related (Alternative Diagnosis)
- Negative Rapid COVID test if symptomatic

If a student is fully vaccinated and a household member is positive,

- No exclusion is required for asymptomatic individuals
- If symptoms develop, the student will need a test to remain at school


## If a student is a close contact and unvaccinated,

- If the student(s) can isolate from the positive individual, stay out for 5 days and recommended rapid test at school upon return on day 6
- If the student cannot isolate from the positive individual, stay out for 10 days and return on day 11 with a recommended rapid test at school upon return


## If a student tests positive,

- They should stay home for 5 days from the date of symptom onset and return on day 6 regardless of vaccination status. Please provide the school with your positive test results.
- When the student returns they are required to wear a properly fitted mask at all times.
- From return days 6-10 extra-curricular participants may not practice or compete.
*Preschool-IDPH rules require ages 4 and under to remain on the minimum of 10 day school exclusion. Students attending our preschool program are exempt from the 6 day return guidance.
*Always ask for a note to return to school for any appointment. This is especially important during this time. This includes dentist, ortho, eye doctor, etc....

Thank you for keeping us all safe and doing your part to make sure we can continue a successful school year. We are following IDPH guidelines and they are subject to change and we will keep updating you with the changes.
