January was School Board Recognition Month and Gunter ISD was honored to celebrate its trustees for their dedication and commitment to the district's schools and students.

To say our school board is truly loved is an understatement. During the January board meeting, campus by campus, presentations were made to honor our board members. To begin the night, an amazing meal was prepared and served to the board by Mrs. Tiziana Kanouse and Mrs. Brandy Cochran, representing the GHS PTO.

The GES campus presented baskets full of goodies, homemade cards and pictures, and library books were given in honor of each member that will be signed and placed back into the GES library. The GMS campus presented baskets in the shape of a hot air balloon full of goodies. The GHS campus brought students in to honor the board. FFA presented each board member with a gavel made in a correctional facility by prisoners. Two students came as a representative of all the students to verbally say thank you to the board members, and another student presented a painting to the board as a gift of thanks. The GHS campus also presented a gift to each member.

Serving as a link between the community and classroom, school board members are elected to establish the policies that provide the framework for public schools. The Gunter ISD board is responsible for 1120 students, 140 employees and 3 campuses. In addition, Gunter ISD serves as the Fiscal Agent for the Grayson County Special Education SSA
 which serves 12 schools in Grayson County. The Gunter board is also responsible for their 130 employees.
"School boards are essential to a strong public education system," Texas Association of School Boards (TASB) Executive Director Dan Troxell said. "They provide the local governance and oversight that makes it possible for school districts to serve students, including establishing a strategic plan, adopting policies, approving a budget and selecting and evaluating a superintendent. It's fitting that we celebrate them in January as their leadership is key to the success of every school district in Texas."
