FAST FACTS...

The Continental Local School District encompasses 80 square miles. Our buses transport over 192 students on six bus routes at around 370 miles per day. Approximately 8,145 miles per month are put on our fleet of nine buses. Including regular bus routes, athletic trips and field trips, approximately 1,537 gallons of fuel are used each month. Currently, our buses range from the oldest 2007 to the newest 2022. The Continental bus fleet of nine has a total of more than 769,177 miles. We currently have 4 propane buses (one being wheelchair accessible) and 5 diesel buses. We have six regular route drivers and five substitute drivers.

It is very important to keep buses as up-to-date as possible for safety and to keep repair costs at a minimum. Buses are, however, very expensive, costing approximately \$96,000 each. The Continental School District the oldest bus on a biannual basis and budget permits.





Although our submissions were not selected, we were very proud of their pieces and want to share them with you!




Eight Student Artworks Submitted to the NW Ohio Regional Art Show


