
# Senior Spotlight

A big difference between Ennis and Lina's hometown is the population. Ulm's population is about 150,000 people. She notes that although similar to Bozeman, her city is more spread out and comes with bigger roads. A major difference she has noticed with our school is that students here move to different classrooms for each class, whereas in Germany, students mostly stay in the same room, and teachers move to different classrooms instead.

Kropf was able to choose what country she would go to for her exchange, but she did not get to choose which state. Luckily, Lina is outdoorsy and enjoys activities like snowmobiling, skiing, hiking, and horseback riding. Although Lina hasn't been to Montana previously, she has been to the United States, visiting Los Angeles, Las Vegas, and Miami.

Some differences in food she has noticed is that there is more wild game here, and the bread is different: bread is harder and usually served with grapes in Germany. There are a lot of plastic utensils at the restaurants and places to eat in the United States, and this is not the case in Germany. On her first night in Ennis, Kropf ate mountain lion for dinner, and she thought it was really good. She is very excited to eat more of the exotic foods here.

Transportation is also very different in Germany as well. You can usually travel by bus, and they travel up to 186 mph. Transportation use in Germany is six times greater than in the United states. Germany actually discourages people from owning cars or parking vehicles.

# Mustang Men's Basketball

For the Mustangs' first game of the season, they faced off against the Twin Bridges Falcons on December 4. The boys lost this game 67-53. The team played hard; starters Jaxson Kloote (senior) and Clintin Buyan (sophomore) both fouled out. Their leading scorer of the game was Buyan with 18 points.

The team then traveled to Lewistown on December 9 for the Lewistown Invitational Tournament. The first match was played against Denton-Geyser-Stanford. They won this game 67-56. After beating the Bearcats, they played Geraldine-Highwood. The Mustangs came out victorious again with a score of 48 -39.

On December 14, the team went up against Gardiner. They came out victorious 65-36. Their leading scorer for this game was Clintin Buyan with 22 points. Close behind Buyan was senior Brand Ostler with 18 points. Next they faced off against Sheridan on December 17, whom they defeated 57-45.

They faced off against Lone Peak at home on January 6. After a great first half from the Mustangs, the Big Horns came back and tightened the score to a single possession. The Mustangs still came out victorious with a final score of 60-53.

The next day the team played West Yellowstone at home. In a long battle for both teams, the Wolverines defeated the Stangs 41 -44.

Missing starter Andrew Beardsley (junior) and 6th man Bo Kelley (senior), the team headed to Sheridan on January 14 . The Mustangs took a hard loss, 40-44.

Ennis traveled to Big Sky to take on Lone Peak in the second matchup of the season on January 18. They defeated the Big Horns for a

second time, 71-65. Buyan led the team with 29 points, followed by Andrew Beardsley with 14 points.

After Lone Peak the boys had another chance at Twin Bridges on January 20; they played the best they had all season and won 56-49.



# Lady Mustangs Basketball

At the Lewistown tournament on December 9, the Lady Mustangs defeated the Denton-Geyser-Stanford Bearcats. They also defeated Geraldine-Highwood with a final score of 41-28.

Next, the girls defeated the Gardiner Bruins on December 14 with a score of 54-43. A few days later on December 17, they played the Sheridan Panthers at home and won handily with a score of 54-22.

On their return from winter break, the girls defeated Lone Peak on January 6 (55-38), Sheridan again (58-27), lost to Twin, and on January 21, the Mustangs defeated Lima at home in a sweeping victory, the final score being 60 - 17.

Senior Shelbey Klein states that she is "very glad she hasn't fouled out this year." Referencing their game versus Lone Peak on January 6, senior Shae Lovett proudly claimed that rival team Lone Peak "lives and dies by

the three point line, and this time they died."

According to multiple members of the varsity team, they all need to work on boxing out and getting in shape. As the season has gone on, the team has formed a strong bond and has learned to work together very well.

The JV team has two more games left in the season. As for varsity, Districts will take place on February 18 - 19, followed by Divisionals on February 24 -26. If all goes well, they'll make an appearance at State March 9-12.

# Speech and Drama Wraps Up Their Season

The EHS Speech and Drama team has done exceptionally well this season. Their first meet was held at East Helena High, the second one was in Boulder, the third meet was in Townsend, the fourth was in Billings, Divisionals was in Manhattan, and State was in Billings.

At the East Helena Meet, for the drama participants, we had a win by Levi Whitehurst (Humorous Solo), a sixth place finish by Pyper Curry (Dramatic Solo), and seventh by Elizabeth Olson, Ruby Blazer (Humorous Duo), and Tara Jensen (Dramatic Solo). In the Speech category, Josey Blazer (Impromptu) and Sage Canterbury (Memorized Public Address) got third, and Noni Dilschneider (MPA) came in fourth. Ennis was third in sweeps for both Speech and Drama categories for Class B/C schools.

In Drama, Levi Whitehurst won at the Boulder meet on December 4, Jensen placed second, Curry came in fourth, and Blazer and Olson placed seventh. For Speech, Canterbury came in second along with Blazer, and Dilschneider placed third. EHS placed first overall in Class C Speech.

Their third meet was held in Townsend on December 18 where Dilschneider took first place, Canterbury came in second, and Blazer placed fifth. In Drama, Whitehurst came in second, Jensen placed fourth, and Blazer, Olson, and Curry all placed fifth in their

respective events. EHS placed second overall for class C in both Speech and Drama categories.

The fourth meet was hosted in Billings by Lockwood and Billings Central on January 15. The team added two new members before this meet: Aaliya Howard (Spontaneous Oral Interpretation), and Haley Anzic (SPOI). The placements for that meet were: Blazer and Olson placed 3rd in Humorous Duo, and Aaliya Howard came in 8th place in SPOI. Ennis placed first in Class C Drama.

Divisionals was held in Manhattan on January 22. Each competitor had to place in the top 8 in order to qualify for State. In Speech, Blazer placed sixth, Dilschneider placed third, and Canterbury came in fifth. For Drama, Jensen won her event, Whitehurst placed third, and Blazer and Olson placed fourth. EHS won Divisionals for Class C Drama.

Speech, Drama, and Debate came and went in a flash. State was held in Huntley Project, on January 28 and 29, about 30 minutes outside of Billings. Overall, there were six rounds including semifinals and finals; each round lasted for around an hour. Everyone made it to semifinals, but sadly Canterbury and Dilschneider could not join Whitehurst and Jensen in finals. In the end, Whitehurst placed 3rd in Humorous Solo, and Jensen placed 4th in Dramatic Solo. Congratulations to all the participants.

This song is so cute, and it really makes you feel like you're driving 174.6 mph while screaming this at the top of your lungs in a coming of age movie.




"Ends of the Earth" by Lord Huron


"Until I Found You" is a beautiful representation of passion towards another human being. It is written to sound like a 50's love song, while also capturing the clarity of a newer song. 10/10.

## Winter Fruit Salad with Maple- Lime Dressing

Prep time: 20 minutes

Cook time: 10 minutes

Total time: 30 minutes

### Ingredients

Winter Fruit Salad

2 red apples, cored and diced

2 pears, cored and diced

4 clementine oranges, peeled and separated into segments

3 kiwi fruit, peeled and sliced into thin rounds and then slice rounds into quarters

½ cup dried cranberries

1 cup pomegranate seeds

Maple Lime Dressing

2 tablespoons maple syrup

1 tablespoon lime juice, freshly squeezed



### Directions

1. Combine all salad ingredients(except the dressing ingredients) in a large bowl.
2. In a separate small bowl, whisk together the dressing ingredients (maple syrup and lime juice).
3. Pour the dressing over the salad and gently toss to coat.

Serve immediately.

1 serving

### Ingredients

1 large sweet potato or yam

4 tablespoons olive oil

½ teaspoon salt

½ teaspoon pepper

1 teaspoon dried thyme

### Directions

1. Preheat the oven to 400°F. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
2. Cut the sweet potato into  $\frac{1}{3}$  -inch slices. In a medium bowl, toss the sweet potato slices with olive oil until fully coated. Add the seasonings and toss to coat. Arrange the slices on a baking sheet without overlapping the potatoes.
3. Bake for 25- 35 minutes, flipping halfway until golden brown. Let the slices cool to room temperature.
4. Enjoy!


*I made a list of pickup lines and added my own commentary.*

# Love at First Viewing



67.9/10. Horrible movie. Ryan Gosling isn't even that cute. He kind of looks like he's seven years old and he also radiates 5'8" energy.




## ***Pride and Prejudice***
