Moultrie County Farm Bureau Charles B. Shuman Memorial Scholarship

The Charles B. Shuman Memorial Scholarship was established in January of 2000 by the Moultrie County Farm Bureau to honor the achievements and life of a Moultrie County farmer and Farm Bureau leader. Shuman had confidence in the common man, believing that a good education, a positive attitude, and moral discipline allow an individual to achieve his full potential in a free society. He was a champion of individual freedom and responsibility.

Charles B. Shuman (1907-1999)

Charles B. Shuman was born on a farm in East Nelson Township. He attended a one-room country school and graduated from Sullivan High School in 1924. He received his BS and MS degrees in agricultural economics and agronomy from the University of Illinois. It was a rare accomplishment for farm boys of his day, which would foreshadow his many achievements.

When he started farming in 1929, at the beginning of the Great Depression, he saw the many needs of farmers. He helped organize the Coles-Moultrie Electric Cooperative, Moultrie Grain Association, and the first consolidated school district in the county. He was an early hybrid seed corn producer, a breeder of Duroc hogs and Angus cattle, and became involved in local livestock marketing and production credit cooperatives. He served as President of the Moultrie County Farm Bureau from 1936 to 1945.

Shuman was elected President of the Illinois Farm Bureau (IAA) in 1945 and of the American Farm Bureau Federation in 1954. As a respected leader and spokesman for the nearly two million farmer members of the nation's largest farm organization, he fought hard and successfully to steer government agricultural policy towards a free market system and away from the socialistic production and price controls of the previous thirty years.

After retiring from his 34 years of Farm Bureau leadership in 1970, he continued his public service on religious, corporate, and higher education boards. He was in demand as a public speaker, and wrote frequent letters to editors and a column for the local weekly newspaper. He was devoted to his family and church, teaching Sunday school for almost 65 years at the Sullivan First United Methodist Church.

Charles B. Shuman demonstrated good moral character as a farmer, leader, and in his personal life. His humble approach and genuine demeanor made him effective with world leaders, U.S. Presidents, and his farmer neighbors alike. With this \$500 scholarship, the Moultrie County Farm Bureau honors the life of Charles B. Shuman by assisting outstanding students from his home county to achieve their full potential.

Purpose of Farm Bureau

In 1955 Shuman said, "Farm Bureau is a free, independent, non-governmental, voluntary organization of farm and ranch families united for the purpose of analyzing their problems and formulating action to achieve educational improvement, economic opportunity and social achievement, thereby promoting the national welfare. Farm Bureau is local, national and international in its scope and influence; and is non-partisan, non-sectarian, and non-secret in character."

One of the first actions of Shuman as president of the AFBF in 1955, was to direct the formulation of this statement of purpose

Dear Applicant:

Thank you for your interest in the Charles B. Shuman Memorial Scholarship which was established by the Moultrie County Farm Bureau in January 2000. A scholarship of \$500 will be awarded annually to a qualified applicant. To be eligible for consideration, an applicant must meet the following standards:

- 1. Live in Moultrie County, Illinois.
- 2. Be a High School graduate or a freshman, sophomore, or junior, in a post-secondary school.
 - 3. Exhibit potential for successful completion of course of study.
 - 4. Study agriculture or related fields.
 - 5. Be of good moral character.

The scholarship will be awarded based on the applicant's academic performance, rank in class, past scholastic honors, extracurricular activities and community involvement.

A completed application consists of several parts: This application, High School Transcript, and/or College Transcript, an essay of 200 words or more, and two letters of recommendation--one from a teacher or professor and one from a character reference.
