Dear Parent/Guardian:

The Rochester School District believes in providing the highest quality of education for every student. To meet this goal, we have a tiered approach to reading instruction. Each tier provides additional support beyond the core program (Tier 1). Students needing strategic or intensive instruction will be monitored frequently to ensure they are making adequate progress. Students will continue to participate in the core program even if they need the support of interventions.

This spring, our reading team is piloting mCLASS Intervention. This program helps students gain a better understanding of the five big ideas in reading: phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension--the essential facets of becoming a proficient reader.

How Does mCLASS Intervention Work?

Students in mCLASS Intervention are placed into small groups based on instructional needs. Every ten lessons, students' progress will be assessed, and instruction will be modified as necessary. This means that students may be moving in and out of reading intervention groups throughout the term, based on the needs demonstrated after analysis of progress monitoring results.

What Type of Content Does mCLASS Intervention have?

mCLASS Intervention is filled with a variety of immersive content: informative and interesting reading selections, imaginative plays that students produce with their groups, and countless interactive activities and games.




