

## Beavers Fall Short To MVP Titans

On Thursday, February 3, the Hanson boys' basketball team traveled to Mount Vernon to take on the Mt. Vernon/Plankinton Titans.

The varsity team battled back and forth with the Titans, but came up short three points at the buzzer. By the end of the first quarter, the game was tied, each team with 10 points. At halftime, the lead was in favor of the Titans, but only by three points, 20-23. The Beavers came out strong in the second half and kept the game close. When time ran out in the third quarter, the Titans had increased their lead to five points, 28-33. During the fourth quarter, the lead went back and forth with each team earning the lead a couple times. Despite the Beavers' determination, MVP hit a three-pointer with seven seconds left on the clock, defeating the Beavers, 50-53.

Leading the team in scoring was Noah Price with 25 points. Luke Haiar had a great performance, recording 12 points, four rebounds, two assists, three steals, and one block. Ethan Cheeseman put up seven points for the Beavers. Isayah Price grabbed six rebounds, while Cheeseman followed with five. Cheeseman racked up two assists, two steals, and one block as well.

As a team, the varsity shot 17/31 (54.8%) on two-pointers; and were 1/7 (14.3%) outside the

perimeter. At the free throw line, the Beavers made 13/20 (65%).

The varsity record stands at 10-5.

Despite the loss for the varsity team, both the C-team and junior varsity dominated on the floor. The C-team won 45-25 and was led by Ben Wilber, who scored 16 points. Scoring was evenly distributed throughout the team. Keaton Weber put up 10 points while Jeren Zens added six points. Carson Ferry chipped in four points while Cole Dewald added a three-pointer. Conner Endorf and Carter Endorf scored two points apiece.

The C-team moved their record to 6-1.

For the JV, the Beavers won 45-25, improving their record to 14-0. I. Price was the lead scorer with 14 points. Hayden Schroeder ended with seven points while Sutton Dewald and Hadley Wallace scored six points apiece. Other scorers were Ben Wilber, five points; Weber, four points; and AJ Wilber, three points.

The Hanson boys basketball team host Freeman on Tuesday, February 8, for Senior Night and will play Platte-Geddes in the Dakota Wesleyan University Culver's Classic in Salem at 1:30 PM on Saturday, February 12.
