

### Fourth Grade Math Vocabulary Terms

- Algebraic Thinking variable, equivalent, equation, relationship, extraneous
- Base Ten Operations composite, addend, Fahrenheit, calculate, estimation
- Fractions denominator, divisor, quotient, mixed number
- Measurement & Data coordinates, system, conversion, nonstandard units, interpret, bar graph
- Geometry intersection, circumference, polyhedron, rhombus, parallelogram



### Reading

Students spent their week learning about trees. We read an informational text called "A Tree is Growing". Our skill this week was text features. We spent a lot of time practicing identifying text features in a nonfiction text, and identifying why text features are important. Ask you child about text features!



#### Math

Skills learned this week: Rectangular Prisms, Counting Cubes, Volume, Geometric Solids

Skills coming up: Multiplication Facts: 11s and 12s, Multiplying There Numbers, Multiplying Multiples of Ten, Length: cm, m, km



### Social Studies

Third graders started their lesson in scarcity and trade. We talked about supply and demand this week, as well as discussing briefly what international trade is through a fun video. Ask your child about supply and demand!



### Science

Third graders continue their unit about Magnetism and Electricity. The students complete lesson one about electrical currents and static. We will move into Lesson 2: Magnetism next week.





### Writing



### Writing Class



- 4 th Grade: Students are really learning how to be detectives in finding evidence and then acting as lawyers to explain and defend the evidence. We finished classroom practice by typing a final draft together.
- 5<sup>th</sup> Grade: Students in 5<sup>th</sup> grade are learning how to compare and contrast factual information about 2 states. After charting similarities and differences, we have been working to write compare/ contrast essays with specific words that signal comparison and opposition.
- 6 th Grade: This week, we have focused on a variety of skills. Grammar, persuasive essay prep, responding to a prompt, and making revisions have been our focus. Through these stations, students are learning how to become better writers.




### **Concepts in Science**

Discrete trial training (DTT), also known as discrete trial instruction (DTI) is one teaching style and example used in ABA therapy. The purpose of discrete trial training is to break down skills into smaller, or more discrete components that allows for quicker success.
