### **Administration**

- **COVID-19** (**Coronavirus**): Due to health and safety precautions, Las Cruces Public Schools will be implementing comprehensive safety guidelines. - **Head Start Program Updates:** LCPS Head Start applied for, and was awarded the following funding opportunities. The following were also approved by the Governing Body (LCPS School Board) and Head Start Policy Council:
  - o 2021-2022 Continuation Grant
  - Cost of Living Adjustment Grant
  - o American Rescue Grant (exempt from Governing Body and Policy Council approval)
  - o COVID-19 Funds (exempt from Governing Body and Policy Council approval)

  - August 6: Teacher Work Days
  - August 9: Virtual Home Visits
  - August 10: Transition Day (offered at multiple times to meet families' needs)
  - o August 11: First Day of Class for Preschoolers

#### **Education**

- **Summer Enrichment:** In June, LCPS Preschoolers had the opportunity to participate in Summer Enrichment where they participated in hands on learning, outdoor play, learning centers, Kindermusik, Waterford, and more. Meals and snacks were provided.
- **Transition Day:** Transition Day was held on August 10, 2021. Transition is an educational opportunity for families to learn about LCPS Preschool Program offerings and expectations. Families engaged in activities that will help them to understand their child's preschool journey towards kindergarten readiness to include curriculum, assessments, parent involvement opportunities, and more.
- Educational Curriculum & Learning Resources: LCPS preschoolers will be learning from research-based programs and materials including:

- Three Cheers for Pre-K: Comprehensive learning curriculum in English and Spanish; this has replaced OWL as the primary preschool curriculum in LCPS.
- Waterford: Web-based literacy & numeracy development, accessible at school and home
- Heggarty: Phonemic and phonological awareness by literacy
- Kindermusik: Music & Literacy Kimochis: Social-emotional learning
