- Create a classroom environment that actively engages students and is developmentally appropriate for the students' age, maturity, and interests.
- Employ a variety of instructional and assessment strategies, including, but not limited to, direct instruction, guided practice, demonstrations, discussions, and learning activities to facilitate knowledge and skill development.
- Plan, develop, and execute lessons that reflect the course curriculum.
- Perform non-instructional duties, including curriculum and instruction development, student supervision, class activities.
- Serve as a grade level advisor.
- Continually communicate with students and parents about academic and behavioral expectations.
- Participate in staff development activities, in-services, and staff meetings as required or assigned
- Attend professional meetings, educational conferences, and teacher training workshops.
- Work cooperatively and effectively with fellow staff members to ensure consistency of the Collegiate Arts program.
- Perform other duties assigned by the Head of School.
