NEWS FROM THE CLASSROOM...

Preschool friends started our month off learning about the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. We learned to identify the main characters in the story and the setting; where the story takes place. We are also learning to identify the beginning, middle and end of the story and sequence the events that occurred. Our friends reinforced the concept of opposites and comparative adjectives to describe things by size (big, bigger and big-Finally, we learned a few fun gest). facts about bear and the animals that hibernate throughout the winter months.

Kindergarten has been learning about penguins through stories and crafts. We also have been learning our sight words and tapping out. Math we are learning about addition and subtraction. We also talked and read stories on What is Science.

First Grade will be celebrating the 100th day of school on Thursday February 10th. We will complete some fun group activities. 1st is now learning about the suffix "s" in Fundations. We are also getting ready to start our new chapter in Math on place value.

Second Grade began to celebrate Black History Month by learning about Jackie Robinson, Frederick Douglas, and Garrett Morgan. They built their knowledge through children's literature, independent research on Epic Books, and corresponding Language Arts activities. In Ms. Levine's ELA class students have been working hard on the new iRead and System 44 stories. Students worked hard on making sure they capitalized all proper nouns when completing writing assignments this week. Students also began working on our February "Kindness" bulletin board. In math students continue to make progress on their specific topics. In science students focused on natural disasters (earthquakes, volcanoes, and tsunamis) and created marshmallow

buildings to see if they could withstand an earthquake.

Third Graders have been learning about famous African Americans in history for Black History Month. Students are also celebrating the 100th day of school by writing about what their lives will be like if they were 100 years old!

Fourth Graders are studying the American Revolution. Did you know that NJ is considered the crossroads of the revolution? We are also studying Patricia Bath and Margaret Knight in preparation for project night. Students have been also drafting opinion writings on which animal would be a great pet. Mrs. McCann's students have been very busy beginning and completing multiplication facts, skip counting, arrays and the use of tables. We have shared videos and morning meeting slides, each day for Black History Month to share one person each day and how the have changed the country we live in, the past and present. Students are recording a person each day on a calendar to review and reflect on what we have learned each day.

Fifth Graders are excited to be working on Black History Month projects! We've decorated our hallway, started our "Fact a Day" calendars, and have chosen our Notable African American Figures. All month long we will be researching who we chose so we can create a resume and cover letter about them and then present our person to the class to culminate our activities. In Mrs. Milewski's ELA class students are researching Historical African Americans. We are finishing up our System 44 book The Narrative of Frederick Douglass. Students are writing biographies in a comic or Powerpoint format. In math students created snowmen using related facts.

Special Areas

STEAM:

All grade levels are studying the artist Mary Blair in preparation for Project Night. Each grade will recreate a piece of artwork from Mrs. Blair's collection. Grade level mediums will vary per grade level: watercolor, crayon resistance, pencil and computer graphics.




QUEST: All of the QUEST classes have been continuing to use children's literature to work on a variety of skills. We are reading, writing, making social-emotional connections, and even engineering. 4th grade QUEST classes have been working with the story Drawn Together. We've discussed social awareness and are using the story to help us build bridges to connect with people in our life from different generations. We are even using the engineering process to plan and build our own bridges to connect the gap between two places.



G&T: All G&T classes are working through the writing process! Many students have moved on to their rough drafts. Next we will work on editing with our peers and with Mrs. Holcomb!

COMPUTERS: In the Computer Lab, the students are learning how to create and debug algorithms using a drag and drop language called blockly! This is teaching them the fundamentals of coding in JavaScript. So far we are coding characters to walk through mazes, animating scenes, building video games and more!

LIBRARY: Do you speak "Bug"? We do thanks to author Carson Ellis and his book called "Du Iz Tak"? The story, told in gibberish, is about some bugs who discover a tiny plant emerging from the ground. They are very curious and not sure what it is so they enlist the help of wise Icky. As the plant grows, so do their ideas! There are hilarious conversations between the bugs as they build a tree fort, a spider comes unexpectedly, and the weather starts to change. Using expression and intonation, Ms. Tyler speaks "Bug" and the children are able to translate what the busy bugs are saying as the little plant grows into a beautiful



"gladdenboot" which translates to "flower". The attention to detail and the vivid illustrations help tell the story just as much as the bugs do. It is no surprise that this picture book was a recipient of a 2017 Caldecott Honor for its illustrations. February 16 & 17
