Below is some information you may want to know for the upcoming week:

School Open Houses

3) Improve the Climate at Millington Community Schools

I have always felt that when people feel that they are appreciated and supported, they work harder and are more satisfied with their jobs on a daily basis. Though I know that the world is not perfect and people may not always agree with all of the decisions I make, it has always been my goal to make Millington Community Schools a better place to work and learn. The MCS Strategic Plan has a goal of improving the climate by being more responsive to stakeholders by conducting annual surveys and focus groups for all staff, students, and community members. The district also staffs each building with a Behavior Interventionist, who will work with staff to reboot our CARDS Positive Behavior Program district-wide.

Automated Attendance Calls

School attendance is one of the most important indicators of student achievement. In an effort to communicate with families, Millington Community Schools will be implementing Automated Attendance Calls, which will go out at 5:00 pm on each day that school is in session. The automated calls will inform parents and guardians of any absences their child may have had during the school day. Parents are encouraged to notify the school office when their son or daughter is going to be absent from school. As another reminder to families, our schools will also send out attendance letters on a regular basis once students have three, five, eight, ten, or twelve unexcused absences.
