School Functioning Updates and Priorities:

Having absences as well due to Covid

Franklin: Ken -

- 120 students absent today. Police presence due to the social media threats.
- Have had significant Covid outbreak. many students and staff out
- Goal is to keep school open to support students

Grants Updates:

• Promising Futures Grant: Barb Updated

To support MTSSB, defined as:

NH's Multi-Tiered System of Supports for Behavioral Health & Wellness (MTSS-B)

Part of the larger children's system of care in NH, MTSS-B is a comprehensive system of social, emotional, and behavioral supports to promote student wellness and improve engagement in learning. MTSS-B's integrated delivery system depends on intentional collaboration between school districts and their community mental health and youth/family-serving partners. Based on the Interconnected Systems Framework, MTSS-B blends research-based school mental health practices and social-emotional learning with a tiered prevention framework that offers school wide social-emotional and behavioral programs at the universal level (Tier 1), targeted supports for at-risk students (Tier 2), and intensive, individualized services for the highest-need students (Tier 3).

- Switching from CPI to MANDT for crisis intervention and response approach; 3 School staff will be trained as instructors in January
- CPI recertification is happening in January, as well, to support intervention through the remainder of this school year
- Going to do Youth Leaders CONNECT program through NAMI to re-start our peer education about mental health awareness and suicide prevention. Finalizing dates for January (Day 1) and Feb (Day 2)

- DAY 1: Space for up to 40 adults; after adults from Franklin and Newfound School districts (total 10-12), we will have some open spots for community partners. Stay tuned!!
- DAY 2: Have space for 30 students and 10 adults. WIII be collaborating with Newfound School District
