

Teaching children about kindness is not just a nice thing to do. It is an essential part of character education and there are many physical, emotional and mental health benefits associated with



kindness. Here at Hawthorne Park Elementary there are many lessons and activities that focus on teaching kindness. Here are some of the benefits your children will experience from learning values such as kindness.

- 1. Happier Children-Studies show that kindness activates the joyful area of the brain.
- 2. Improved health and less stress-Being kind increases happiness and decreases stress.
- 3. Increased feelings of Gratitude-Children learn to appreciate what they have when helping those less fortunate.
- 4. Less Bullying-Research has documented that the effects of bullying can be significantly reduced by integrating kindness programs.
- 5. Better Concentration and Improved Results-Kindness is a key ingredient that helps children feel good about themselves.



From the Desk of Nurse Berrouet

In order to achieve the goal of minimizing the spread of communicable disease at school the following criteria may be considered reasons to keep a child home from school:

- 1. Acute phase of cold/upper respiratory infection (cough, runny nose, fever 100 or grader).
- 2. Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea (three or more times in six hours).

If antibiotics are needed, the student should remain home for at least the first twenty-four hours. Students with vomiting and/or diarrhea, fever may not return to school until they have not had an incident for twenty-four hours and are fever-free without the use of any medication such as ibuprofen and acetaminophen.







CHRONIC ABSENTEEISM

Chronic absenteeism- defined as students missing 10 percent or more of school days. Students who are chronically absent are more likely to lack reading skills, have lower test scores, and receive exclusionary school discipline, and they are in higher jeopardy of not graduating.

We use restorative justice practices to address poor behavior choices and promote inclusive peer conflict resolution. Teaching staff, parents, and students have learned to speak, listen, hear, and, most importantly, understand each other, which has minimized the number of discipline referrals and suspensions, fostering a warm and loving school environment for students to learn.



RESTORATIVE CIRCLES

A restorative circle is a technique that builds and restores relationships through equal opportunity sharing and listening. These talking circles proactively build the skills individuals need and gives every individual the opportunity to speak and be heard.
