Pulaski Elementary School Language Arts Goals:

Performance Indicators

1) There is a 70% pass rate for ALL students on the Spring 2022 SOL Test for English. This was a decrease of 2.1 percentage points from the previous school year. The goal for Spring 2022 was to maintain or increase the pass rate by 2 percentage points or better for ALL students.

Target Performance

- 2) The pass rate for Students with Disabilities was 50.45%. This was an increase of 10 percentage points. The goal again this year is to reduce the failure rate of 49.55% by at least 10%, which then will give us a new pass rate of 60%
- 3) Students in K-2 will increase the number of students meeting the PALS end of the year Benchmark by 10%.

Rationale (current status)

- Kindergarten ended the year with 36/92 students Identified. This was a pass rate of 61%. Our new pass rate will be 67%
- First Grade ended of the year with 40/79 students Identified. This was a pass rate of 49%. Our new pass rate will be 54%
- Second Grade ended the year with 31/73 students Identified. This was a pass rate of 58%. Our new pass rate will be 64%.

Pulaski Elementary School Math Goals:

- 1. There is a low pass rate for ALL students on the Spring 2021 SOL Test for Math. This is an increase of 0 percentage points from the previous school year. The goal for Spring 2022 is to increase the pass rate by 5 percentage points or better for ALL students.
- 2. The pass rate for Students with Disabilities was 69.39%. This was an increase of 6.39 percentage points and just 1% point of the required pass rate for Accreditation for Math. The goal this year is to make the Accreditation rate of 70% pass rate or reduce the failure rate of 30.61% by 10%, which then will give us a new pass rate of 72.45%.
- 3. At least 70% of students in grades K-2 will meet the goal of at or above grade level on end of the year assessments in math.
