If the appeal is accepted, the high school would make AYP. Perry Elementary did not make AYP based on the students with disabilities subgroup. Mr. Judd outlined the steps Perry Elementary is taking this year to improve scores. Perry-Morrice Adult & Alternative Education Program did not make AYP. Morrice Area Schools is now the programs judiciary agent and their scores will not reflect Perry Public Schools in the future.

Possible addition of a fourth third-grade section at Perry Elementary School

You will see that on Monday's regular board meeting agenda is a New Business item that we had not discussed at our Committee-of-the-Whole meeting two weeks ago—the possible addition of another third-grade section. This recommendation came about as a result of a couple of recent meetings, the first with the three Title I teachers and Mike Judd, the second with Mr. Judd alone. The rationale for this, the reason why it was not discussed earlier, and the impact of such a move are discussed below:

- One of the documents accompanying this is entitled, 2012-13 Class Configuration. Upon your
 review you will notice that our third-grade numbers are the highest, thirty-two each, a number that
 is much higher than our goal, which is a maximum of twenty-eight. Adding a fourth section will get
 the class sizes down to twenty-four, a much more manageable number.
- That same document will show you that our fourth-grade numbers are not much better. Our
 budget deficit makes it difficult to justify adding two new sections, let alone one, so we're sticking
 with third grade. Besides, our fourth grade students are performing with a significantly greater
 proficiency than are our third graders. {See the next bullet point.}
- The accompanying document entitled, Fall 2012 DRA/DIBELS Benchmark Results, reveals that 53% of our third graders (see the rightmost column) are not reading at that grade's benchmark level. True, 70% of the second graders are not reading at their proper level either, but at least their class sizes are more appropriate than the third grades. We will pour more Title I services into both grades, but reducing the class sizes at third grade is a good first step.
- Why didn't we anticipate these numbers earlier to avoid making this change now? Last year's
 second grade count was eighty-three, so we had no reason to believe that the total would increase
 by another thirteen. Plus, we wanted to wait until a couple of weeks into the school year, to see if
 the class sizes would decrease. We waited and they did not (thankfully). Seeing an increase in
 student count at any level is a good thing.
- Will parents be bothered by this? Some may, but overall we think parents will appreciate smaller class sizes for their third-grader.
- How will the decision be made as to which children get moved? That hasn't been decided yet.
 The first step is not that, but it is making the decision whether or not to do this.
- The third document accompanying this, the one entitled, Checklist for adding a 4th section of 3rd grade, is from Mr. Judd and shows a suggested timeline and task list, as well as some rationale for making this move.
- The total cost for a first year teacher (depending on the level of benefits he/she receives) is around \$62,000.

For the reasons mentioned above and in the attachments, it is the recommendation of Mike Judd and me that we add another section of third grade.
