What Has Changed At Center Cass Since November 2022?

Financial - The District:

- issued the last set of Tax Anticipation Warrants to bridge the gap until dollars from the referendum arrive.
- continues to become more efficient as a school district by reducing expense and maximizing existing resources.
- continues to analyze regional data on employee groups and uses the information to settle new contracts and adjust schedules.
- communicated that a portion of new dollars each year would be set aside to rebuild fund balances and remove reliance on early taxes.

Staff - The District:

- advertised and posted most of the needed positions outlined in communications. Some of these positions will be shared positions between buildings until we are in a better financial position to provide more service.
- began interviewing and hiring needed personnel for 23-24 school year.
- invested in employee development with trainings occurring inside and outside the District.

Students - The District:

- restored student clubs and activities in early December for all 3 schools.
- restored field trips for spring of 2023.
- · ordered needed technology for learning.

Facility and Safety - The District:

- awarded bid for the Lakeview intercom replacement for summer 2023.
- started planning for a fire alarm upgrade/replacement for all 3 schools for summer 2024.
- completed a lighting retrofit project inside all 3 schools with the help of grant funds.
- started conversations with the County and Village about SRO assistance.
- began security camera upgrades for each school.

District 66 would like to thank the community for their contributions and support in restoring educational excellence.

<u>PLEASE NOTE:</u> According to the March 2023 DuPage County Computation Report, community members should be receiving their tax bill after May 1st, which should reflect a tax rate of \$2.70 as discussed at April 12th's Board of Education meeting. Please know that District 66 has no control over the community's final tax bill.



The Main flag pole at the Lakeview/Prairieview Campus had the main cable snap while lowering to half staff last week which then also took out the main cable winch system. Repairs and part estimates to repair the 23 year old pole were astronomical and weeks out. Brainstorming between Mr. Tiede and Mr. Alberto reminded us that we had made modifications to the former IDE flagpole years ago which suffered similar failures and the DWFD had offered to help feed the new cable through the top of the pole utilizing their ladder truck. We devised a similar repair plan and reached out to the DWFD to ask if they may be able to assist again. Monday 4/3, the DWFD came and fed the new flag cable through the flagpole assembly down to Mr. Alberto on the ground so that modifications and repairs could be completed. This help saved the district on time and money and allowed us to have our main flag up and visible for the following election day. Thank you again to Fire Chief James Karasek, Lieutenant Shawn Lamb & FF/PM Carlos Rojas and the rest of the department for helping us with these repairs.
