Opening of Meeting**A. Call to Order**

Vice President, Tammy Neumann called the Regular Meeting of the Board of Education to order with the Pledge of Allegiance at 7:04 p.m.

Presentations

No presentations for September 2018.

Public Comments

Vice President, Tammy Neumann opened the floor to public comments.

Ms. Sheila Burnham from East Meredith, New York addressed the Board of Education with a proposal for more local support to the school district (see handout attached). Ms. Burnham and her husband homeschool their children, and she is representing many of them with the request for the Board of Education to allow homeschooled students to participate in the sports programs. Ms. Burnham stated there are homeschool students within the district who could help boost the school's sports teams, clubs, and other activities because of their desire and ability to play, act, and otherwise contribute. Families that homeschool their children are also taxpayers in the community. Ms. Burnham made a request to the Board of Education to make a change to the current policy to allow homeschool students to participate in the school's intramural activities.

The Board thanked Ms. Burnham for her comments.

Ms. Doreen McGrath, a Teacher, thanked Mr. Shultz, Business Administrator, for coming into her class each year to explain the budget process. She said this has been very helpful and she's always impressed by how attentive the students are.

The Board thanked Ms. McGrath for her comments.

Ms. Ailisa Boyer, Delhi resident stated she has a kindergartner this year. It is her first child going off to school and she is new to the system in every way. She is concerned about the physical safety of the building, in light of the world we're living in, and asked what the school has done to address this challenge. Trustee Neumann encouraged Ms. Boyer to contact Ms. Mable, Elementary Principal, for answers. She may also contact Mr. Shultz, Business Administrator or Mr. Bartlett, Buildings and Grounds Supervisor.

The Board thanked Ms. Boyer for her comments.

On a motion made by Mark Schneider, seconded by Elizabeth Huneke, the Board of Education approved a recommendation to create a part-time, 60%, technological interventionist position for the 2018-2019 school year to assist students in grades K-5, to be paid from the current general operating budget, and a salary of not more than \$29,999.00. Policy Review / Adoption

- A. Meal Payment and Charge Policy - 2nd Reading

The Board held the second reading of the Meal Payment and Charge Policy. Mark Schneider requested the district clerk to review the language, particularly section IV and get back to the Board. There were no further questions, comments, or discussion. The Board will hold the final reading and adopt the policy in October.

No Old Business for September 2018**New Business****A. Recommendation to Add Licensed Teaching Assistant or Aide Position**

On a motion made by Mark Schneider, seconded by Kenneth Aikens, the Board of Education approved a recommendation to add one LTA or Aide position due to additional enrollment of students in the middle/high school and to support safety efforts in the middle/high school building. There were no questions, comments, or discussion, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. Lease Agreement - American Legion 2018-2020

On a motion made by Seth Haight, seconded by Elizabeth Huneke, the District approved, and the President of the Board of Education was authorized to sign a new Lease Agreement effective September 1, 2018, for the District's continued use of American Legion playing fields and grounds in the form approved by the Board's attorney; and it is further RESOLVED, that the District's continued lease of the American Legion's fields and grounds is a Type II action under 6 NYCRR section 617.5 (2), (8), (15) and/or (26) having no potential for significant adverse environmental impacts and is therefore not subject to further environmental review.

Trustee, Mark Schneider congratulated Mr. Thomson and Mr. McKeegan for their work involved in the lease agreement. He said he doubted they would be able to come to a mutual agreement, but it worked out well.

Trustee, Tammy Neumann agreed with Trustee Schneider and stated it took a lot of effort, but with a great result.

There were no further questions, comments, or discussion, and the motion carried unanimously.

C. Letter of Intent - Bus Lease

On a motion made by Lucy Kelly, seconded by Elizabeth Huneke, the Board of Education approved a Letter of Intent Subject to Voter Approval on May 21, 2019, for the leasing of nine (9) 2020 model 66 passenger Thomas Saf-T Liner C2 school buses. Trustee, Mark Schneider noted the "really important language" stated in the letter of intent is that the lease is subject to approval by the voters in May 2019. Mr. Thomson stated the district experiences savings by approving the letter of intent now because it locks in the price. Trustee, Tammy Neumann commented that it makes the budget process easier to have the price locked in. There were no further questions, comments, or discussion, and the motion carried unanimously.

D. Request to Remove Books from Use/Discard

On a motion made by Mark Schneider, seconded by Kenneth Aikens, the Board of Education approved requests from elementary teachers (see attached) to remove books from use as they no longer use them in their curriculum, are old, or out-of-date. There were no questions, comments, or discussion, and the motion carried unanimously.

E. Excess Equipment - DASH

On a motion made by Mark Schneider, seconded by Kenneth Aikens, the Board of Education approved a request from the nursing department to deem one wheelchair, manufacturer unknown, model unknown, and the condition is poor as excess equipment. There were no questions, comments, or discussion, and the motion carried unanimously.

F. Excess Equipment - Technology

On a motion made by Mark Schneider, seconded by Kenneth Aikens, the Board of Education approved a request from the technology department to deem the attached list of equipment as excess as the items have no value. There were no questions, comments, or discussion, and the motion carried unanimously.

G. Revised Tax Collection Dates 2018

On a motion made by Elizabeth Huneke, seconded by Lucy Kelly, the Board approved revision to the delinquent tax penalties for the tax collection dates to be revised due to the late release of the tax bills as follows: September 11, 2018, through October 11, 2018 - no penalty, October 12, 2018, through November 1, 2018 - 2% penalty added, November 2, 2018, through November 9, 2018 - 3% penalty added. There were no questions, comments, or discussion, and the motion carried unanimously.

Public Comments

Vice President, Tammy Neumann, opened the floor to public comments.

Ms. Katherine Gielskie, a Homeschool Parent, asked the Board to consider Ms. Burnham's earlier request to change policy to include homeschool students to participate in intermural and interscholastic events. She stated the law gives the district the power to make a decision to make policy and she encouraged the Board to explore the possibility of allowing homeschool participation.

The Board thanked Ms. Gielskie for her comments.

Board Comments

Seth Haight congratulated everyone on a great start to a brand new year. He thinks the cell phone policy is a good change. He also noted the Board is being proactive with information for the vote.

Lucy Kelly commended Ms. Mable on her ability to notify classes and individuals that may be in need of help with supplies, with doing so in a non-embarrassing way. She thanked Ms. Mable for doing that.

Lucy Kelly thanked Robin Robbins for trying to alleviate the heat in the classrooms for teachers. She thanked the audience for their suggestions and noted the Board will take the suggestions to heart.

Elizabeth Huneke thanked the families that homeschool their children for their interest in participating in the public school activities.

Kenneth Aikens commented he is still taking so much in, but it sounds like we are off to a good school year. He hopes he's learning as fast as the kids are. He's spoken with administrator's and others, and he thanked them for their time in helping him to learn more about how the district works.

There were no further Board comments.

Want More Local Support for District Proposals?

There are home school students within the district who could help boost the school's sports teams, clubs and other activities because of their want and ability to play, act and otherwise contribute.

Currently the board may create and adopt policy that allows for home school students to play if they are enrolled for the "equivalent of three regular courses" and the other qualifications given in the Codes, Rules & Regulations (below).

8 NYCRR §135.4(c)(7)(ii)(b)

(2) Registration. A pupil shall be eligible for interschool competition in a sport during a semester, provided that he is a bona fide student, enrolled during the first 15 school days of such semester, is registered in the equivalent of three regular courses, is meeting the physical education requirement, and has been in regular attendance 80 percent of the school time, bona fide absence caused by personal illness excepted.

8 NYCRR §135.1

(g) *Bona fide student* means a regularly enrolled student who is taking sufficient subjects to make an aggregate amount of three courses and who satisfies the physical education requirement.

(m) *Intramural activities* mean those activities conducted within one school district involving only those pupils enrolled in such school district and which are organized to serve the entire enrollment.

Adding Value to Our Quickly Diminishing Population, Why

Given that it has been proposed to upgrade the facilities, increasing local participation in sports and other intramural activities would increase the demand/want in an area with quickly diminishing population.

The population is decreasing because there is no real incentive to stay in the area, except for the people and the beauty of the land. The people, overall, are better, nicer, more helpful and community-oriented here than any other place we've been. (Obviously there are exceptions.) The landscape, topography and scenery here are gorgeous.

However, there's no new, incoming production facilities. There's no incentive for new production facilities to bring a new job force to the area. Even our local Internet speeds and reliability are of second-world quality at best.

The people are already over-taxed, including the paying of school taxes by home school families, who aren't currently allowed to participate in the district's intramural activities. Is that balanced exchange?

Please Take Action Beneficial to Our Community

It seems that a new consideration of the distribution of school resources should allow for greater participation in, and support of, the school's intramural activities.

Please get ahead of the curve and enact some policy that allows home school students the choice to participate IFF (if and only if) they're willing to abide by the standards set in the NYCRR. What has been the opportunity cost for not doing so already?

You have the power under the law to make it so, to help benefit, include and empower more of the community. What's wrong with doing so?
