New York State Budget Highlights

Pro's

- Elimination of Gap Elimination Adjustment (GEA)
- ▶ GEA restored to Delaware Academy in 2016-2017 is \$466,653
- Total GEA Delaware Academy has lost since 2009-2010 is \$7,878, 573

Con's

- > Tax cap calculation
 - Growth factor states 2% or CPI, whichever is lower. Growth factor for 2016-2017 is .12%
 - Permissible exclusions lower than in previous years causing the calculated tax cap to be negative for 2016-2017
- Delaware Academy's current cap is -2.48% or -\$226,000
- No increase in Foundation Aid due to Delaware Academy being considered a high wealth district.

Effects of a Negative Tax Cap

- If Delaware Academy accepts the 2016-2017 tax cap, the district would have to reduce its overall levy by \$226,000
 - This reduction would eliminate the addition of new initiatives for students
 - It would also create budgetary issues next year since the district would be operating with a smaller starting tax base amount.
