### Departmental Reports -

Ms. Marian Chrisman, Business Administrator reported:

- Kellogg funds have decreased by \$209,547.
- Our school lunch fund profit was nominal at \$70. January is a 3-pay period month which impacts the profit by about \$7,000.
- We locked in our fuel bids for 2014-2015 through DCMO BOCES. Heating fuel increased by 5 cents a gallon, diesel increased by 9 cents.
- The Board was given budget binders to start reviewing for the March 10 workshop. Currently the budget is \$358,000 more than last years' equating to a 1.95% increase. This draft contains everything asked for. The property tax cap is calculated at 1.46%. Our allowable tax cap which included exclusion for the Capital funding would have given us an additional \$9,680. With this type of an increase it would mean using \$900,000 of Fund Balance which I'm sure we won't want to do. She is working with Mr. Thomson and they are contemplating various ways to reduce spending to present for the Board's consideration at the March 10 workshop.

- January 30<sup>th</sup> we received notification from Bassett Healthcare Network's 5210 program that the district has been awarded two mini grants. One grant in the amount of \$1,795 for an expansion on our existing school garden program. The second grant is in the amount of \$895 for New York Agriculture in the Classroom Agriculture Literacy books and educator guides for teachers K-3.
- April 28<sup>th</sup> thru May 2<sup>nd</sup> she will be representing New York State nationally at the annual United States Department of Agriculture Produce Safety University training in Fredericksburg, Virginia. The all expenses paid trip to Fredericksburg includes a one-week training course designed to help school foodservice staff identify and manage food safety risks associated with fresh produce. PSU addresses produce purchased from traditional suppliers, direct from farmers, and through the DOD Fresh program. The curriculum covers all aspects of the fresh produce supply chain including growing, harvesting, storage, and preparation.
- March 22<sup>nd</sup> Delaware Academy will be hosting the Junior Iron Chef Competition sponsored by Farm Catskills and Bassett Healthcare Network's 5210.
