#### Departmental Reports:

Ms. Marian Chrisman, Business Administrator reported:

- Kellogg funds have increased by \$348,804. The \$1,972,164 balance in Kellogg Capital had been transferred to Delhi Capital. SubSub 4 has been renamed Abraham L. Kellogg Memorial Fund and has a current balance of \$1,293,062. Scholarship checks have been issued and mailed.
- No Cafeteria Fund Profit and Loss during July and August.
- Cooperstown purchased our bus for the same price originally sold on ebay for \$38,000.
- Tax warrant is to be adopted and signed tonight. Passed out some data comparisons for the past 4 years. Even though our levy only increased 2%, the assessed values have changed which dramatically impact tax rates. For instance our full value assessment went from 12.72 to 13.33, a 4% tax increase. The Village and Town of Delhi which has taken a hit in previous years, actually increase only .44% this year. The village and town make up 50% of the tax base.
- Gearing up for the start of tax collection to begin September 3<sup>rd</sup>. Our cash flow balance consisting of funds in the Fund Balance tide us over in July and August. Since 50% of our income comes from taxes we typically do not have to borrow to cover our first few months of expenses until State Aid starts to flow.

Mr. Luke Potrzeba, Technology Supervisor reported:

Approval SEQRA Resolution – Sap House

On a motion made by Trustee Tammy Neumann, seconded by Trustee Wayne Oliver, the Board approved the following SEQRA Resolution:

A RESOLUTION MAKING CERTAIN DETERMINATIONS PURSUANT TO 6 NYCRR PART 617 WITH RESPECT TO A CAPITAL PROJECT PROPOSED TO BE UNDERTAKEN BY THE DELAWARE ACADEMY CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT AT DELHI.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Delaware Academy Central School District at Delhi, Delaware County, New York, has under consideration a fully functional 6030 watt grid tied photovoltaic system at the Sap House. Installed system to include 18-335 watt Sunpower modules, Z-DPW top of pole mount, 1-Sunpower 7000 watt inverter, 1-Sunpower monitoring system and all accessories. Total cost of equipment and installation is \$28,250.00. NYSERDA Rebate is \$8,442.00 so total cost to owner is \$19,808.00 as further described in the proposed scope of project attached hereto and hereby made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the work and financing proposed to be undertaken with respect to each element of the Capital Project constitutes a Type I Unlisted Action as defined under the State Environmental Quality Review Act and the regulations promulgated thereunder ("SEQRA"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of said School District now proposes to proceed with the Capital Project and wishes to take all actions necessary in connection therewith in order to comply with SEQRA; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Education of Delaware Academy Central School District at Delhi, Delaware County, New York, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> Pursuant to 6 NYCRR Part 617, the Board of Education hereby determines itself to be Lead Agency for the purposes of determining the environmental impact of the Capital Project.

<u>Section 2.</u> It is hereby determined that the Capital Project constitutes a Type I Unlisted Action under SEQRA.

Section 3. The Board has completed and hereby approves a Short Form Environmental Impact Statement and hereby determines that the work and financing with respect to each element of the Capital Project will not have a significant effect on the environment, and adopts a "Negative Declaration" and thus, as so defined, said work and financing will not result in any significant adverse environmental impacts.

Section 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
