4. REPORT AND COMMENTS OF PRINCIPALS, COMMITTEES AND VISITORS

5. REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

- The district will be selling items through Purple Wave Auction website. This includes two busses.
- Acorn to Oaks program is a great program held once a week where patrons of the community read to 1st graders.
- The Veteran's Day program was excellent. Mr. Vignery recognized Ruthie Sanders for receiving the teacher award.
- Mr. Vignery is starting the TV program back up. Mr. Macy and Mrs. Wallace will be interviewed for the next episode.
- Special Education has been funded locally for years and has been underfunded. The state is discussing fully
