Motion to approve financial statement. 5. Motion to approve special outdoor liquor permit for Graettinger Veterans Club for September 2023. All ayes. Carried.

Helmich approached the council regarding hiring Chet Caneff full-time with the city, at this time City does not have any full-time openings. We will keep the resumes on file.

Jensen addressed Council regarding speed of motorists on S. Cedar Ave. Council will look into ways to get motorists to slow down. Mayor Flaherty will talk with the Sheriff's office about concerns and options available to the city.

The City of Graettinger was awarded a \$20,000 grant by AARP. With this quick action grant we will assist the Vision committee with the development of Pickleball Court at Graettinger's Citizens Park.

Anderson updated the council on the pool leak. Anderson and Peterson fixed recent leak and were able to get Pool reopened. Christenson Construction will be on site in fall, after pool closure to evaluate pool structure.
