Columbia Borough School District is planning on opening school in-person to faculty, staff, and students for the 2021-2022 school year. The District will continue to monitor and abide by any existing, valid, or binding orders from the CDC that are effective on or after January 13, 2022. If there are any changes or revisions to those applicable requirements or guidelines after January 13, 2022, the District administrative team will follow them, update the plan accordingly, and communicate to stakeholders. On August 4, 2021, the CDC updated universal mask recommendations. CDC continues to recommend universal masks by all students (ages 2 years and older), staff, teachers, and visitors to K-12 schools, regardless of vaccination status.

2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

For the 2021-2022 school year, the District will offer two(2) options for instruction, in-person learning and the Columbia Virtual Academy. Using the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP), the District will provide a free breakfast and lunch for all students. The District will continue to provide social, emotional, and mental health support to students through the school counseling departments and the Student Assistance Program (SAP). If any faculty and/or staff member needs social, emotional, and mental health support, the District will provide education and make resources available on benefit packages and opportunities. District administration will continue to monitor the health of faculty, staff, and students and make decisions that provide the greatest access to educational opportunity while maintaining health and safety for faculty, staff, students, and community members.

For the 2021-2022 school year, the District will continue to monitor the ever-changing and applicable requirements or guidelines from the CDC that are effective on or after January 13, 2022. If there are any changes or revisions to those applicable requirements or guidelines after January 13, 2022, the District administration will follow them, and update the plan accordingly.
