Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports is a **process** for creating school environments that are more predictable and effective for achieving academic and social goals. **PBIS helps** staff, parents, and students create a **ready, respectful, responsible, and positive school culture**.

## How can Parents Help?

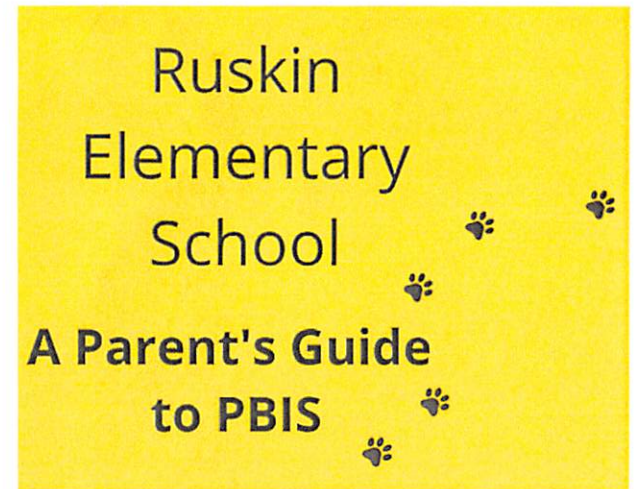
Parents are an important part of PBIS. We encourage parents to use the **same expectations and rules** that the school teaches. This **common language** creates **unified support** for expected behavior. We ask parents to discuss common expectations at home. Children thrive when they have consistent expectations and consequences.

- Getting Teacher's Attention
- Listening to the Speaker
- Staying on Task
- Accepting Consequences
- Using Appropriate Voice Tone
- Working with Others
- Waiting Your Turn

## Ready Behavior

- Hands to yourself
- Walking at all times
- Play carefully
- Have everything you need

## Responsible Choices

- Do your best
- Cooperate and share
- Use appropriate voices
- Honor personal space

## Respectful Actions

- Listening to directions
- Go directly to destination
- Respect the ideas of others
- Clean up your area
- Raise your hand to speak



What does PBIS look like at **Home**?

## Ready Behavior

- Ask before leaving the house
- Use crosswalks
- Wear a helmet
- Stay away from dangerous items

## Responsible Choices

- Be ready to leave on time
- Ask before you borrow
- Go to bed on time
- Complete your chores

## Respectful Actions

- Offer to share
- Use kind words, such as please and thank you.
- Apologize to forgive
- Clean up after yourself

## Ready Behavior

- Give office your correct information
- Sign in and out of the office and shoe picture ID
- Wear Visitor Badge

## Responsible Choices

- Monitor homework and read notes from school
- Check Livingtree and Facebook for updated information
- Send in excuses for absences

## Respectful Actions

- React positively about school with your child
- Model kind words at home
- Support school-wide expectations and district discipline code
