

SAU 90 BACK TO SCHOOL PLAN

Introduction: The plan is predicated on the feedback from our June board meeting and the success of our summer program.

- COVID-19 remains a dynamic situation
- Continue to seek guidance from CDC and DHHS
- Focus on safety and well-being for all
- Prioritize in-person learning
- Mitigation steps will be based on community/county transmission levels
- Provide layers of protection will ensure the safety and well-being of everyone

Our plan has been developed in collaboration with SAU 21 in order to ensure consistency for our Hampton families to the greatest extent possible.

COVID-19 Mitigation and Response Plan 2021-2022

- SAU 90 schools will be fully open and in person
- Full play and participation in athletics/extra curricular activities is anticipated unless transmission levels increase and adjustments are needed
- Masks will be required on school buses based on current federal guidelines (Link)
- The school district will adhere to the current guidelines surrounding health protocols
- All individuals are asked to self-screen at home prior to arrival at school

- The district will make appropriate accommodations of health and safety protocols for students with disabilities. These accommodations will be developed through Special Education and 504 processes.
- All students will have access to free breakfast and lunch during the 2021-2022 school year.
- The schools will remain in session unless closure is recommended by the DHHS.
- The district will adhere to all guidance around contract tracing.
- The superintendent will continue to provide weekly communications around positive cases.
- The district will continue to practice cleaning procedures to provide a safe healthy learning environment.
