



Scholarships are offered to <u>8 to 14 year-old</u>-students in the following areas: Topsham, Harpswell, Bowdoin, Bowdoinham (MSAD 75); Boothbay, Boothbay Harbor, Southport, <u>Edgecomb</u>, Georgetown (AOS 98); Bath, Phippsburg, Woolwich (RSU 1), Dresden, Richmond, <u>Halldale</u>, Monmouth (RSU 2), Litchfield (RSU 4); Durham, Freeport and <u>Pownal</u> (RSU 5); Lisbon,

West Bath, Brunswick, Wiscassett; and Homeschoolers in these areas. Please note that Merrymgeting Audubon (MMA) works closely with the 4-H camps, but we run our own Scholarship Program. The application information is necessary for MMA purposes. The camps require their own registration process.
